WHEN in its December 1944 number College and Research Libraries adopted a typepage similar to that of the A.L.A. Bulletin, the thought was to issue three ninety-six-page numbers and one sixty-four-page number per year and thus to reduce paper consumption while presenting annually the customary amount of printed matter. Pressure for space, however, has rendered a deviation from this plan desirable for Volume VI. The present ninety-six-page number, taking the place of an expected sixty-four-page issue, has become possible through the action of the A.C.R.L. Board of Directors in authorizing an additional appropriation.
