Project Overview:

In this project senior Landscape Architecture and Environmental Engineering students have worked over one teaching semester with guidance from QUT academics, community consultation, and partner organisations to produce a diverse range of options for managing future growth in an area within the Port of Bundaberg. Students have worked in project firms, each firm producing:

- A Strategic Plan which proposes a framework for future directions in terms of a landscape area's local and contextual
- 5 firms have produced an Environmental Management Plan which records actions required to address significant environmental impacts in the implementation of the Strategic Plan
- Detailed Designs of selected places within the Strategic Plan to demonstrate how the Plan's ideas can be enacted on the ground.

At the end of this project, the partners will receive a full set of the student work to be used for further discussion about ideas for the future of the area.

The Project Brief given to the students was to:

Evaluate, undertake planning and design, and make recommendations regarding:

- Interface between Port lands and residential settlement;
- Future residential/urban development;
- Transport accessibility and mobility – road, rail, tramway and maritime for personal and freight movement;
- Local and regional connectivity - both physical and perceptual- between urban settlements of Port of Bundaberg – Burnett Heads and the surrounding area;
- Recreational and tourism development;
- Public/private space mix and access;
- Ecological conservation assets;
- Natural and cultural heritage assets
