Locality:

Nearshore waters of southern California

Purpose:

- To capture, tag, and release Pacific bonito, Sarda chiliensis, and California barracuda, Sphyraena argentea.
- 2. To collect Pacific bonito, California barracuda, white seabass, Cynoscion nobilis, and California yellowtail. Seriola dorsalis, for population identification studies.
- To make incidental collections as requested by other programs

Procedure:

Trolling with feather and "Hexhead" lures was conducted during daylight hours. Angling with live-bait and lures was conducted each morning and evening while the vessel was at anchor. A night light was displayed each night to attract juvenile and larval fish. Surface water temperatures were regularly recorded

Results:

Biologists tagged and released 85 Pacific bonito in waters between Dana Point and La Jolla. A total of 286 California barracuda were tagged and released offshore from the Encina Power Plant site south of Carlsbad, California.

Biologists also captured 5 sublegal length white seabass of which 3 were tagged and released and 2 kept for examination.

Surface water temperatures recorded ranged from 66F recorded off Point Loma to 70F recorded while in the influence of the warmwater discharge from the Encina Power Plant.
