BIG GAME FISH INVESTIGATIONS

Locality:

Inshore waters from Point Dume to Gaviota

Purpose:

- 1. To tag and release Pacific bonito (Sarda chiliensis) and California barracuda (Sphyraena argentea).
- 2. To collect eye lenses from Pacific bonito for population studies.
- 3. To tag and release any Pacific mackerel (Scomber japonicus) and jack mackerel (Trachurus symmetricus) taken incidentally.
- 4. To make incidental collections as requested by other investigations.

Procedure:

Trolling with jigs was conducted during daylight hours in order to capture fish for tagging. Still fishing with bait was done under lights at night.

Results:

Due to dense fog, fishing time was restricted to a day and a half. Fishing effort was concentrated from Point Dume to Gaviota with most effort occurring offshore of Santa Barbara. A total of 16 bonito, ranging in size from 51 to 66 cm, was tagged and released. These fish were in the I and II age groups. All bonito were caught on trolled jigs during daylight hours. Sea surface water temperatures ranged from 60 to 62.5°F. No Pacific mackerel, jack mackerel, or barracuda were tagged.
