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Stocks of Grain

Iowa: Corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2007 totaled 824 million bushels, down 15 percent from the 969 million bushels on hand June 1 of last year. Of the total stocks, 55 percent were stored on-farm. The March - May 2007 disappearance totaled 543 million bushels, 5 percent below the 570 million bushels used last year.

Soybeans stored in all positions on June 1, 2007 totaled 255 million bushels, up 12 percent from the 229 million bushels on hand June 1, 2006. Of the total stocks, 49 percent were stored on-farm. Disappearance of soybean stocks for the March - May 2007 period was 125 million bushels, 11 percent below the 141 million bushels used last year.

Oat stocks stored in all positions on June 1, 2007 totaled 7.76 million bushels, up 13 percent from a year ago. Of the total stocks, 14 percent were stored on-farm.

United States: Corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2007 totaled 3.53 billion bushels, down 19 percent from June 1, 2006. Of the total stocks, 1.83 billion bushels are stored on farms, down 22 percent from a year earlier.

Off-farm stocks, at 1.71 billion bushels, are down 15 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2007 indicated disappearance is 2.53 billion bushels, compared with 2.63 billion bushels during the same period last year.

Soybeans stored in all positions on June 1, 2007 totaled 1.09 billion bushels, up 10 percent from June 1, 2006 and the largest June 1 stocks on record. On-farm stocks totaled 500 million bushels, up 1 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 591 million bushels, are up 19 percent from the previous year. Indicated disappearance for the March - May 2007 quarter totaled 696 million bushels, up 3 percent from the same period a year earlier.

All wheat stored in all positions on June 1, 2007 totaled 456 million bushels, down 20 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 73.2 million bushels, down 34 percent from last year. Off-farm stocks, at 383 million bushels, are down 17 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2007 indicated disappearance is 401 million bushels, up slightly from the same period a year earlier.

Acreage Report

Iowa: Soybeans planted and to be planted is estimated at 8.80 million acres in 2007, down 1.35 million from last year. This is the lowest Iowa soybean plantings since 1994, and the largest year-to-year reduction on record. Corn planted and to be planted increased 13 percent this year for a total of 14.3 million acres. This is the second highest Iowa corn planting on record, just 100,000 acres behind the 14.4 million of 1981. Corn harvested for grain is forecast at 13.95 million acres. If realized, this will be a record high. The acreage estimates in this report are based on data collected from May 25 through June 19.

Additionally, producers reported on the percent of seed planted to genetically modified (GM) varieties. Ninety-four percent of Iowa's soybean acreage is planted to herbicide resistant varieties. The U.S. level is estimated at 91 percent. Corn planted to GM varieties are estimated in Iowa at 22 percent insect resistant (Bt) only and 19 percent herbicide resistant only. Stacked gene varieties account for 37 percent of corn acres for a total planted to GM varieties in Iowa of 78 percent of the total crop.
