- Not all upgrades are steps forward
- Be prepared for the unexpected

- Get a Sense of Where Your Students (or Your Audience) are Coming From
- Consider Assumptions About Students That May Not Be Obvious
- Make sure students know: "It's OK If You Run Into Problems..."
