I employ formal devices with the material that shift from form to formlessness, ultimately being more interested in the poetics of materiality. There are visible and invisible shifts in the project. The visible shifts are concrete. A change in light and surrounding space. The invisible shifts are the scars and imperfections that lie beneath. It is ultimately a search between the light and dark of life.
