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Sue Mahan wants to fold her mentoring committee into the student fairs committee and is asking me how we should proceed. As I was preparing a note to my committee and checked back to the survey results I found the above discrepancy. What to do? The monitoring and mentoring activities mentioned are very different. Student affairs is not the place for monitoring; mentoring makes some sense for the committee, although I've no desire to take on that task at this time. SWS (Sociologists for Women in Society) put a great deal of effort into putting mentoring partners together; it's more time and effort than I have in the present and several-year future. I'm going to share all of this with Sue but also wanted to mention it to you.

This suggests the question: Have you notice the discrepancy or do you not see it as a discrepancy? Secondly, how should the executive board pursue dealing with the issue of monitoring? It's something we might need to begin thinking about (if you see the discrepancy).
