Glad to hear from you! Yes, you are on the Student Affairs Committee again, and yes Tina Crossland did volunteer to co-chair that committee this year but then got shy about it after the fact (like in January). I still have you and her listed as Co-Chairs. I don't vouch for any of those phone numbers or email addresses but that is what I was given last year.

I really don't think Tina has done anything, so let me suggest something the committee could do that would be fairly simple and easy: we will have a permanent room at the conference which we can use all the time for whatever we want. I think it would be nice to have information up there on sexual harassment, mentoring, etc. etc, and perhaps grad school brochures. And maybe you could even get committee members to volunteer to be available in that room at certain times throughout the conference for any student who wanted to come in and chat? Information about the room could be put onto a one-page flyer and given to all students when they register possibly, with some coordination with Sarah Hall, and put onto our Division Information table for people to pick up as they wander by. Or you could schedule chat sessions on topics such as "How do I choose where to do my doctoral studies?" or "How can I survive writing a dissertation?" and just put up bright colored flyers around the conference corridors announcing these. They don't really have to be scheduled through the Program Chair---you just might want to look at the preliminary schedule when it comes out and make sure you avoid times when other student sessions are being held. Well, anyway, you get the idea. Most of those thoughts are fairly easy to organize and can still be done before November. If everyone on the committee took one little task, you could still do a lot. Whatever you can do will be terrific!

As far as the student paper competition is concerned, I have received one paper so far, but the deadline is not until September sometime. The ad will run again in the next Criminologist, so we will see what happens. I will collect any papers and then pass them on to you guys when the time comes.

Thanks for being so responsive. I appreciate your willingness to continue to be active even if you are not going to be in San Diego (which is too bad---sure you can't make it?). Enjoy the rest of your summer. And keep me posted on anything you manage to work out on the Student Affairs stuff. Thanks.
