

#### REGISTRATION NOTES

#### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS.

\* To sit for Part I or Part II of the comprehensive examination you must have a grade point average of at least 3.0, tuition fully paid, and full admission status.

In addition to the above, to be eligible for CSA6090 (Part I), you must have completed 20 credits of coursework, including CSA6060.

To be eligible for CSA6089 (Part II), you must have passed CSA6090 (Part I) and CSA6140 for DBA and DIBA or CSA6210 for DPA, or 6310 for HRM and DBA/HRM, or CSA6440 for DBA/IM or CSA6640 for DBA/HRD.

#### COMPUTER-MEDIATED COURSE (CSA6071):

Students are required to take CSA6071 - Computer Mediated Seminar in Research Methods. The course is in single credit increments. Satisfactory completion of cml is a prerequisite for the other cm segments. Students should register for one credit at a time. Purchase of computer time is in addition to the tuition for the course. Successful completion of the first credit of this course is a prerequisite for CSA6030 - Information & Decision Science and for other courses as indicated. Registration and obtaining a UNIX account is a prerequisite for CSA6060.

#### READINGS COURSES: (CSA6150/6250/6370/6570/6480/6650)

- --- The Dissertation Topic Concept Paper is the first formal step in the process. It is never too soon to start thinking about your dissertation topic.
- ---This concept paper should serve as an opportunity to set out in a concerted manner the area of interest to you for your dissertation. While this can and will be refined along the way, it is very important to start off in the right direction. Therefore, it is important at this point to focus as much as possible upon the feasibility of carrying out your task.
- ---You should include an overview of some relevant literature and identify, as well, any resources at your disposal that will assist you in carrying out the task. Remember, this is your dissertation and it is important that you work in an area of

interest to you as this will be a rather lengthy endeavor. Only those papers submitted with a single topic area will be considered by the Research Office.

- ---Together with this paper, you should submit your resume and the name of the person you wish to have as your Readings instructor for approval by the Research Office. Be sure to have their concurrence prior to submitting their name. (If they are not on the Nova staff, their resume must accompany this submission.)
- ---When your topic is approved you will receive written confirmation from the Research Office. This confirmation will be accompanied by an Instructor Approval Form for the Readings course. Forward to the instructor the Instructor Approval Form for signature. The instructor should then return the form to you.
- ---This form should accompany your registration. It should be sent, together with the appropriate fees, to the Program Office. You will be registered for the course under the instructor's name to facilitate grade processing on your academic record.

NOTE: This is a lengthy process. Please carry out these activities the term before the term during which you wish to take this course.

Please be advised that failure to comply with these instructions will result in your registration being returned.

- This is a methodology review. Do not register for this course until after you have had your dissertation concept paper approved. You will do this course with an instructor who can help you review methodologies appropriate for your dissertation area.

Both cm2 and cm3 must be completed before you submit your proposal.

This course reviews dissertation-related statistical techniques using SPSSX on Nova's VAX computer. Approval of the concept paper is also a prerequisite for this course. Cm4 must be completed before submission of your proposal.

COMPUTER TIME IS REQUIRED FOR THESE COURSES. IT IS TO BE PURCHASED IN INCREMENTS OF 15 HOURS. THE HOURLY CHARGE IS  $$10.00 - (15 \times $10 = $150)$ .
