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

## Challenges

- ➤ 75% of all new, emerging, or reemerging diseases affecting humans at the beginning of the 21<sup>st</sup> century have originated in animals.
- ➤ Global impact of new emergent diseases include HIV/AIDS, severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS), H5N1 avian influenza, and the pandemic 2009 H1N1 influenza virus
- > Serious public health, economic, and development concerns



## Infectious Disease Emergence at Global level




Figure 1 Global examples of emerging and re-emerging infectious diseases, some of which are discussed in the main text. Red represents newly emerging diseases; blue, re-emerging/resurging diseases; black, a 'deliberately emerging' disease. Adapted, with permission, from ref. 23.

## Two main regional programs:


- University networking and capacity building (SEAOHUN – South East Asia One Health University Network)

### **SEAOHUN Objectives**


1.To promote and advance the One Health approach for control of emerging and re-emerging infectious and zoonotic diseases

# National One Health University Networks

- Each of the four countries has subsequently set up a National Network (INDOHUN, MYOHUN, THOHUN, VOHUN) to share and disseminate the benefits of the regional network – SEAOHUN
- These involve multiple faculties within each country who are involved in educating professionals in the skills required to support the One Health approach
- National Network Coordinating capacity is being established in regional faculties (INDOHUN – University of Indonesia, Faculty of Public Health)



## Vietnam One Health University Network (VOHUN)










- Established 22 November 2011
