Background

- USAID re-emphasized the Africa RISING Program character: need for a program proposal
- Split in 3 regional project for budgetary reasons
- USAID requests maximization of cross-country and cross-region learning, synergies for impact at scale
- Needs harmonization of approaches and principles while considering site specific differences

- PCT
- Program Comms team
- Common branding and templates
- Joint learning events
- Exchange visits

Synergy enhancement in phase 2

- Common research questions in 5 areas
- SI indicator framework
- Common engagement standards
- Program-wide analyses, e.g. ex-ante and ex-post evaluation of innovations
- Coordinated Communities of Practice



What are CoPs?

Communities of practice are groups of people who share a passion for something that they know how to do and who interact regularly to learn how to do it better.



Elements of a CoP?

- self-organizing group, balance between formal and informal structure, hierarchy not important, exists beyond organizational borders, creates interlinkages, certain priority to members, bottom-up engagement, has a coordinator/manager
- thematic orientation that is of interest/relevance to the members, expect to improve own practice
- based on practical experience and questions, members share their experience and jointly look for answers to their questions, reality check of own practice



- members have a passion for the CoP because they see a professional benefit out of it
- organizations of the members are committed, define the thematic focus and expected results
