

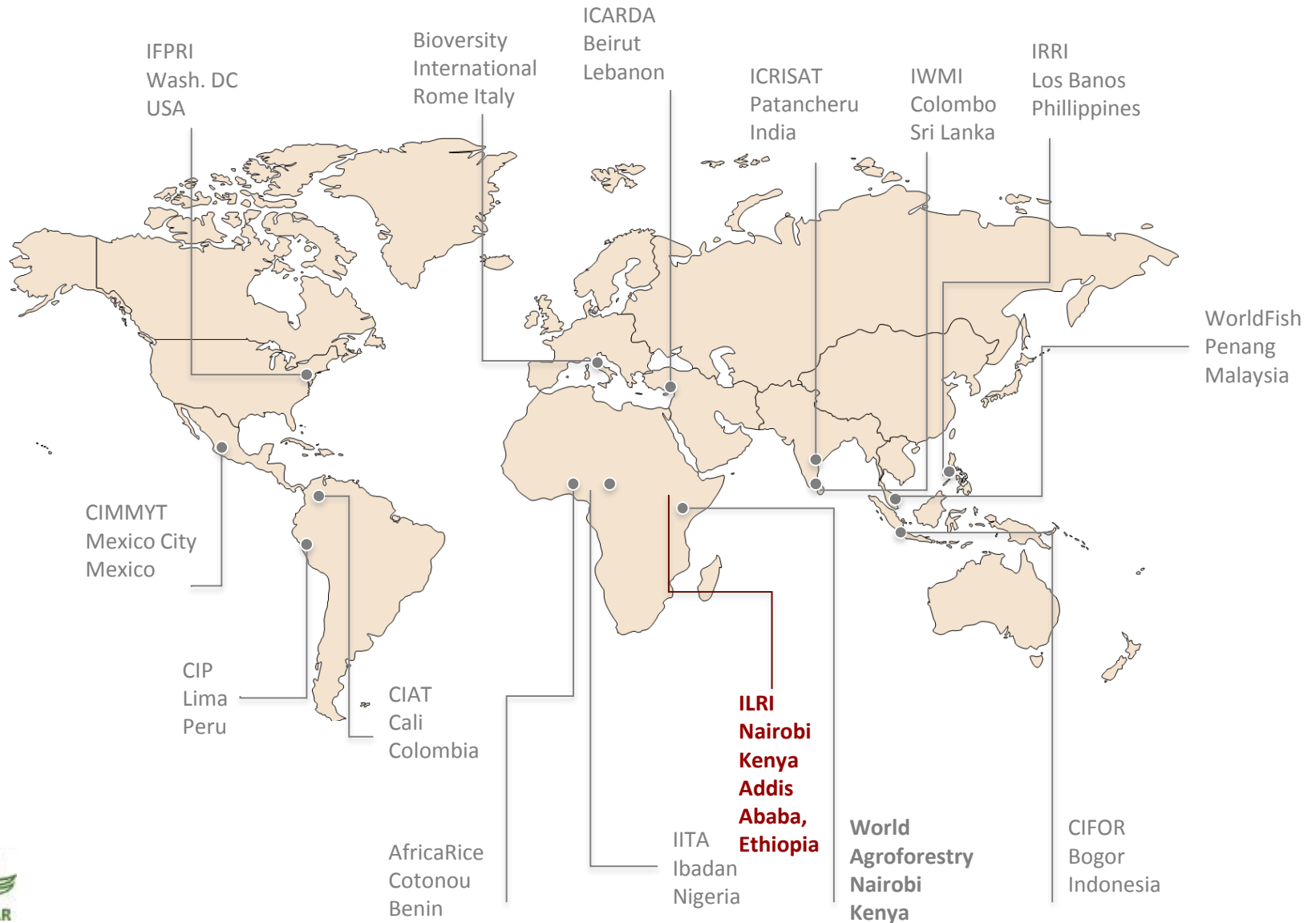

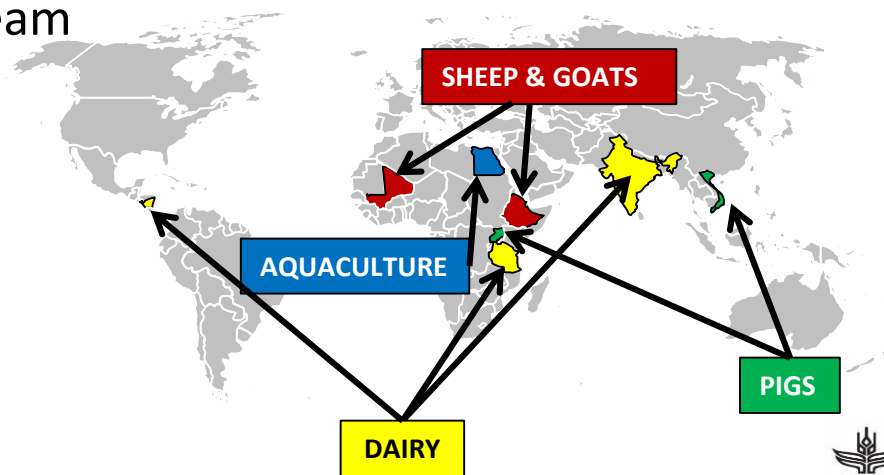

CGIAR Research Program on Livestock & Fish

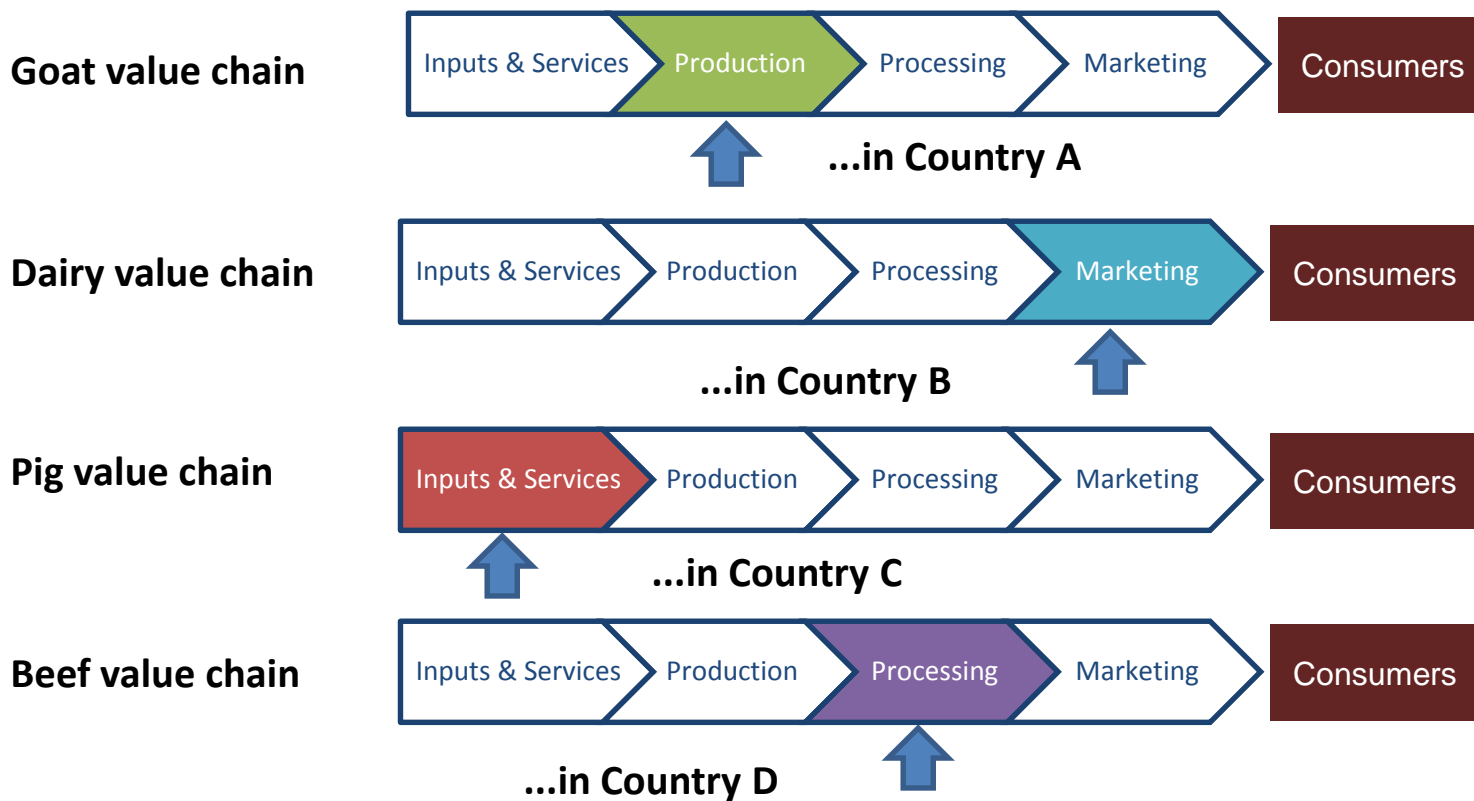
- From 2012, brought together CGIAR capacity: ILRI, CIAT, ICARDA, WorldFish
- Focus on selected countries to transform pro-poor value chains with potential to improve nutrition of low-income consumers: *'By and for the poor'*
- Using research and working with development partners to design and test practical integrated interventions to go to scale
- Smallholder pig value chain in Uganda selected after consultation
- Established new office and team
- Catalyst role in raising visibility of potential offered by pig value chain

Past research has focused on specific aspects of given value chains, commodities and country.

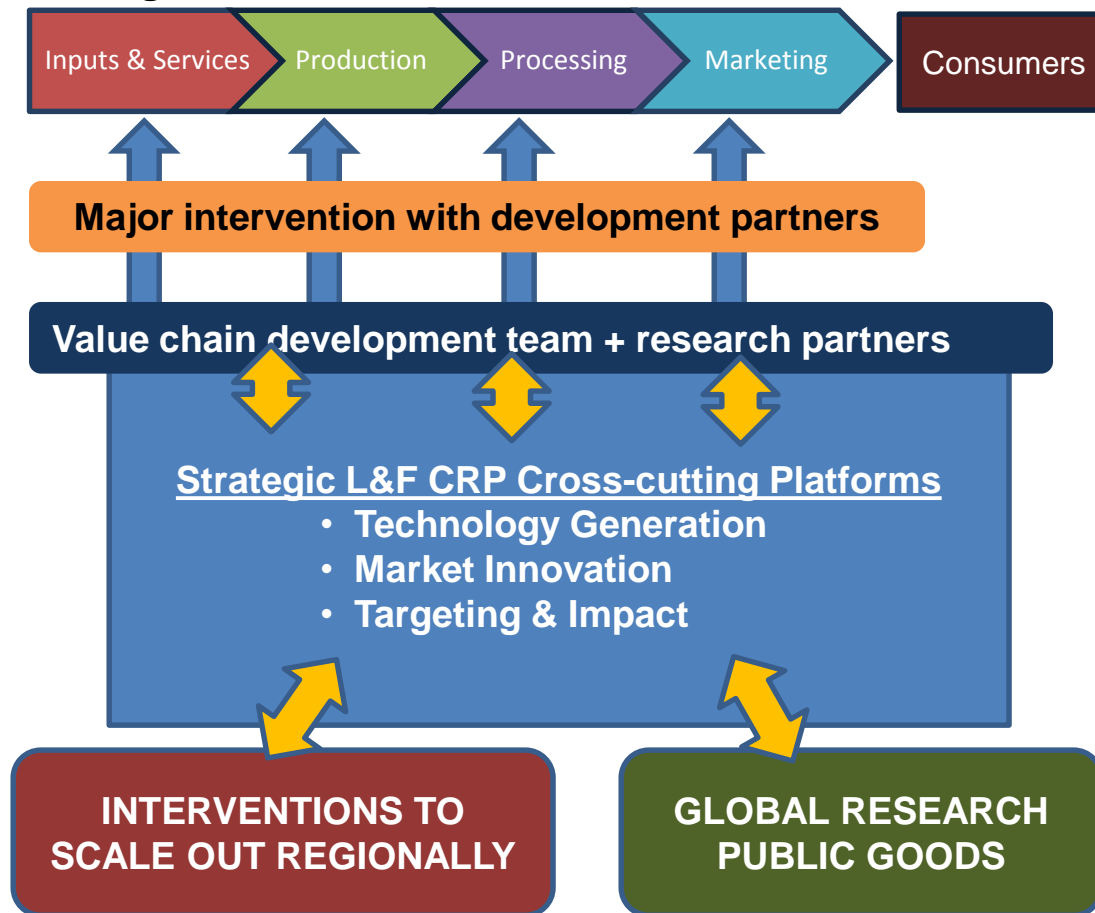


Solution-driven AR4D to achieve impact

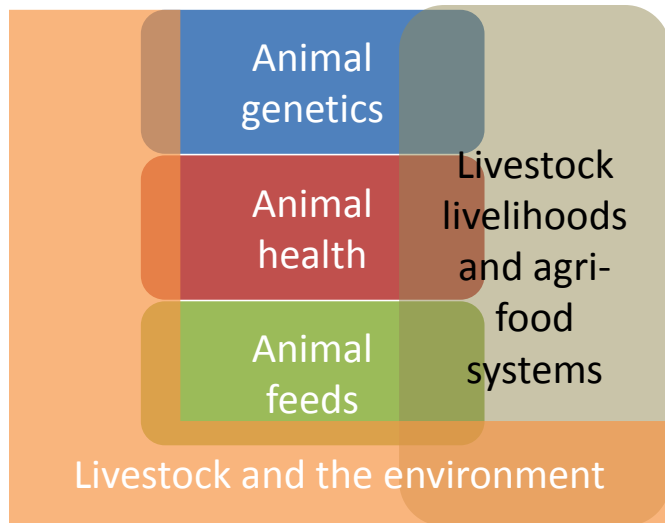
#1: Addressing the whole value chain
