Dean Asks Support . . .

Library Gifts Encouraging; More Needed To Reach Goal

With a first gift of more than \$5,000 from an interested BUSM alumnus, the Alumni Medical Library Campaign was underway with much encouragement.

Other gifts in the thousand dollar range and near it by generous contributors and several contributions of lesser sums continue to inspire workers. Many more are needed to reach the \$300,000 goal.

Since this is a capital gifts campaign, contributions of \$500 and above are sought. But it is realized that recent graduates and alumni of limited means cannot give at this level, and their gifts are equally welcome.

The new library, named for BUSM alumni, is in full operation. The movers completed their work, appropriately enough, during National Library Week.

Many Medical School alumni visited the facilities during Dedication Day for the Instructional Building, of which the Library takes up three floors. Other alumni toured the new quarters during the meeting of the Massachusetts Medical Society and all are welcome at any time.

Dean Franklin G. Ebaugh, Jr., M.D., instrumental in the construction of the BUSM Alumni Medical Library, considers the campaign among graduates for funds his top priority in his last days at B.U. School of Medicine. He recently wrote alumni encouraging each to "contribute to the library what your circumstances permit".

The dean begins duties at the University of Utah in July.

Several BUSM graduates took part in telethons early in June to reach alumni not otherwise contacted in the Alumni Medical Library Campaign.

This telephone call technique was used in Massachusetts and other areas.

Volunteer BUSM alumni called Massachusetts area School of Medicine graduates from the Castle on Bay State Road, formerly the home of BU presidents.

At press time, it was too early to report complete results; but about \$7,000 in

pledges was recorded the first night. Participants were enthused with the results.

Callers contacted fellow alumni primarily by class.

Co-Chairmen Peter L. Sapienza, M.D., '43A, and Andrew D. Elia, M.D., '35, along with Massachusetts State Chairman Herbert I. Posin, M.D., '45, expressed their appreciation to volunteers and for alumni response.

The Alumni Medical Library Campaign is a cooperative effort of the BUSM Alumni Association, graduates, alumni secretary and development office staffs.


