Ofelia Galaviz worked in the vineyards at Sokol Blosser Winery for many years and is now in her 80s and retired.

With basic needs being met through programs like *¡Salud!*, Latinos in the wine industry are able to shift their focus to achieve different goals. Ofelia Galavez and her husband were able to buy land and a house by working at Sokol Blosser Winery, attaining, as she put it, their American Dream. This helped to ensure the possibility of her children's long-term success by instilling in them the importance of work and education. The industry's openness to help newcomers find their place in the community is one reason that Jesus Guillen is still living in the U.S. Over the years, he has received help from area winemakers who were more than willing to share their expertise and help him in his journey, while he adds his own personal signature to the wines he makes.

These stories demonstrate the Oregon wine industry's strong sense of community, and demonstrate the breadth of the work being done by Latinos as part of this community. Many members of the Oregon wine industry, especially Latinos themselves, express hope that there will be continued opportunities to expand beyond the vines.

Eso les ayudó asegurar la posibilidad de éxito por la larga duración para sus niños por inculcar la importancia del trabajo, pero también la importancia de la educación. La orientación inclusiva de la industria para ayudar a personas nuevas a encontrar su lugar en la comunidad es una razón por que Jesús Guillen está viviendo en los Estados Unidos todavía. A través de los años, ha recibido ayuda de viticultores vecindarios, quienes estaban dispuestos a compartir su experiencia y ayudarle en su viaje, mientras determinaba su propia contribución por miedo de los vinos que hace él.*
