

Rock Marks Vineyard Site

Bjelland Vineyards are located two miles north of Tenmile. Just turn on Reston Road and look for the big rock, a historical landmark which is featured on the Bjelland wine label. The vineyards are part of a 200-acre parcel of land surrounded by mountains.

Established in 1968, present plantings cover 28 acres-85 per cent of which is Cabernet Sauvignon. Other plantings are: Gamay Beaujolois, Pinot completed about July 1, 1970. At
