Oregon's wine industry highlights

In 2000, 122 wineries crushed 17,663 tons of grapes, seven percent more than the 1999 crush and 33 percent more than the 1998 crush.

Cooperage capacity increased nine percent from 1999 to 5,233,000 gallons.

Total sales increased 27 percent from 1999 and 11 percent from 1998.

Wineries reported unfilled grape crushing needs of 235 tons in 2000. This is 11 percent lower than 1999. Reported needs were: Pinot Noir - 171 tons, Syrah - 33 tons, White Riesling - 20 tons, Pinot Blanc - 6 tons, Pinot Gris - 3 tons; and all other varieties - 2 tons.

Non-grape wine summary

Wineries produced 33,820 gallons of non-grape wine, 293 more gallons than 1999, not including hard apple cider which is taxed as a wine product. Blackberries were the leading fruit followed by: raspberries, peaches, cranberries, loganberries, rhubarb, plums and currants. Under 1,000 gallons of the following wines were produced: honey, cherries and boysenberries. This summary includes estimates for incomplete responses.
