Dear Mr. Rich:

Your letter of August 5th, was gladly received. I cannot give you a definite statement as to your standing, as our Registrar must pass on that. However, if you wish to take the Philosophical course, you would have to take two years of Latin; two years of German are also required, but in talking it over with Professor Frerichs, our German teacher, he thinks you can make that up easily. He would want you to take some grammar work under him, and would be willing to give you special work in it. I think you would be able to finish the Philosophical course in the four years.

If you took the Scientific course, you would not have to have the Latin, I think. However, you can arrange these matters when you arrive, and I am sure, to your satisfaction.

College opens October 1st; it has been postponed because of the scarcity of labor.
