TO YOU!

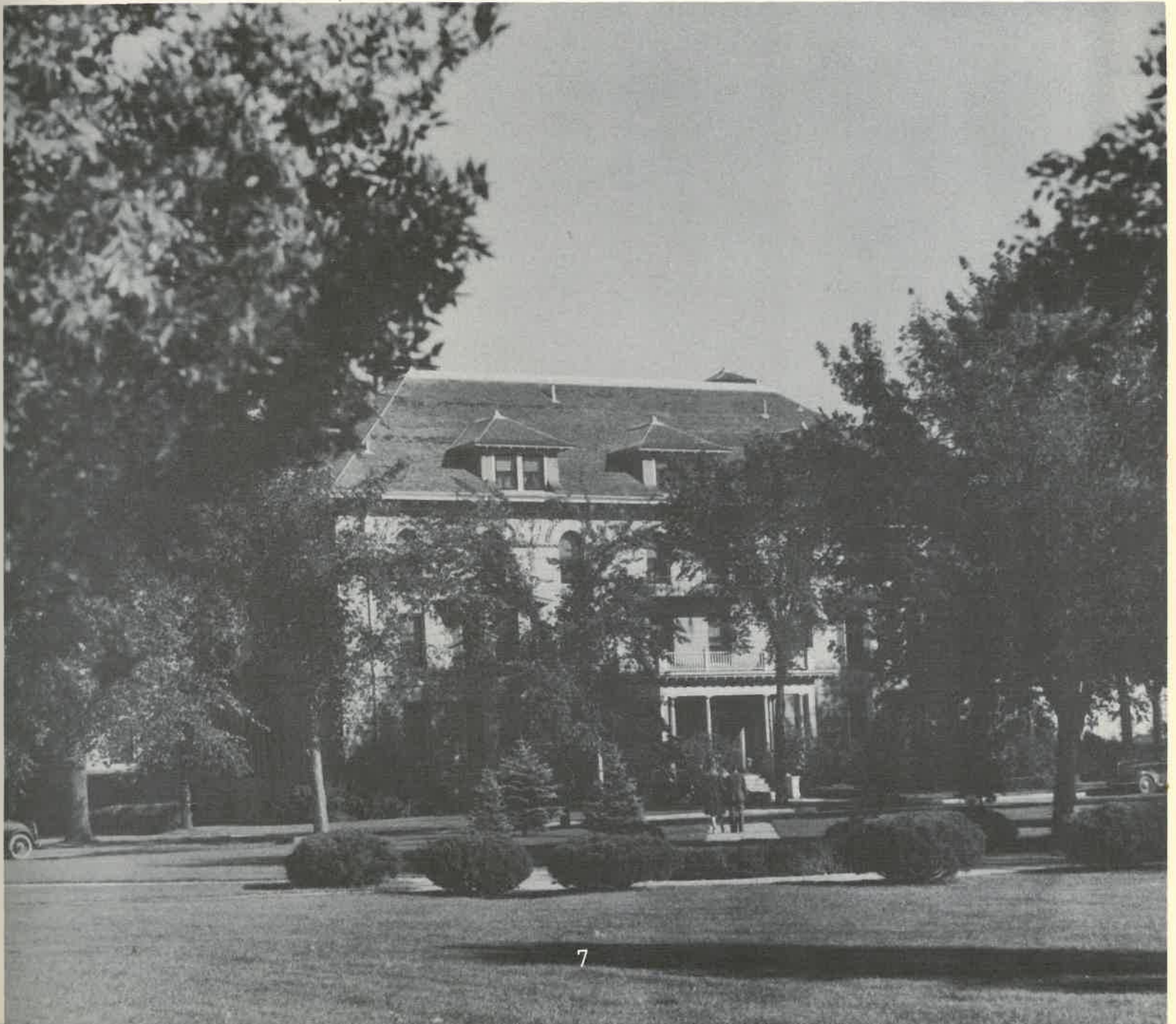

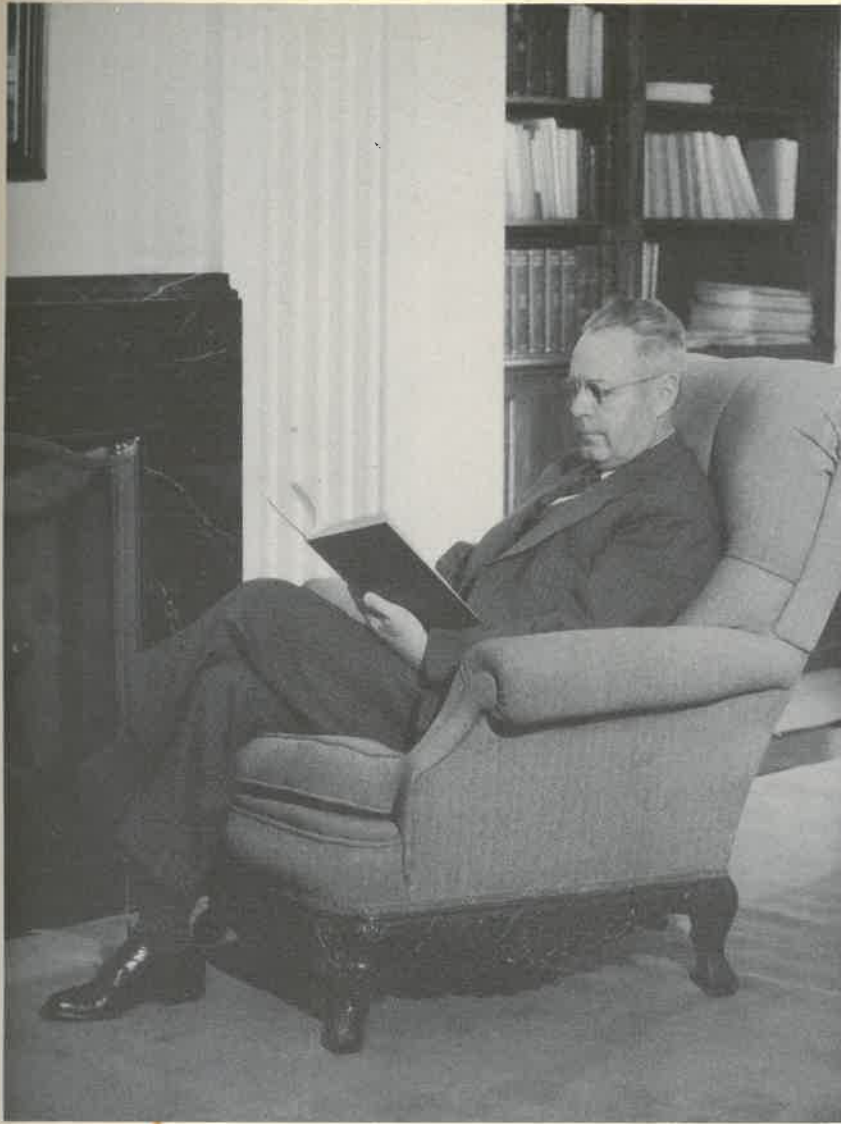

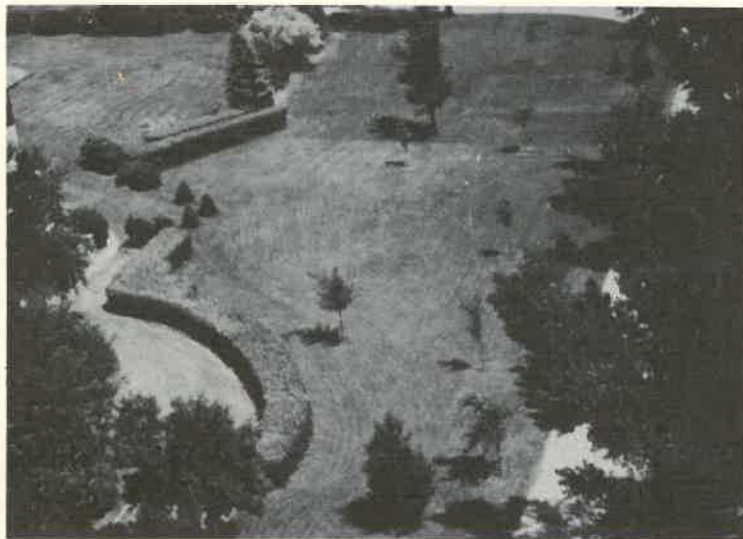

Voice class under direction of Mr. Preston gives an excellent rendition of what and how a singer should perform. This class is one of the five offered in Music 150.

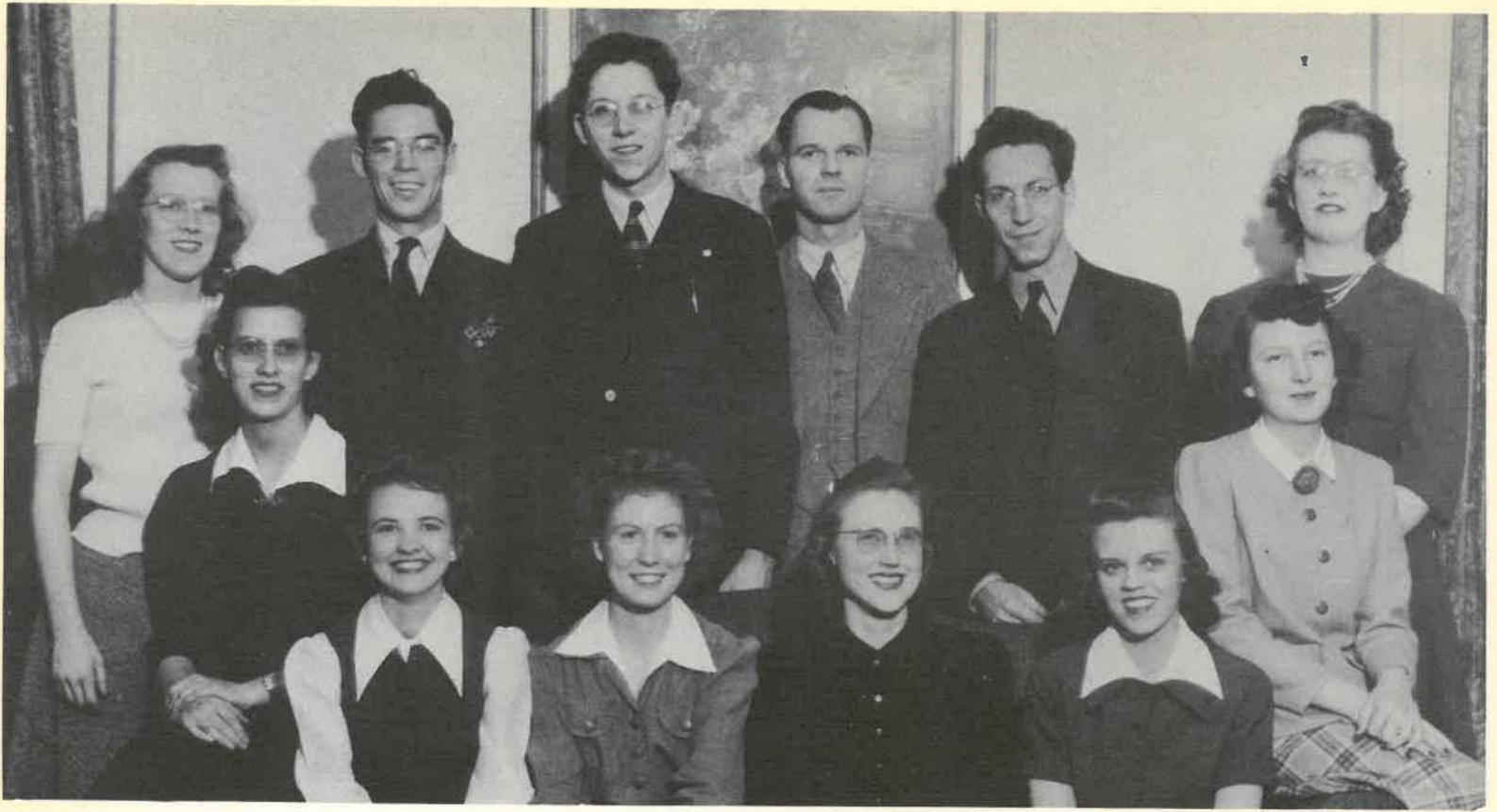

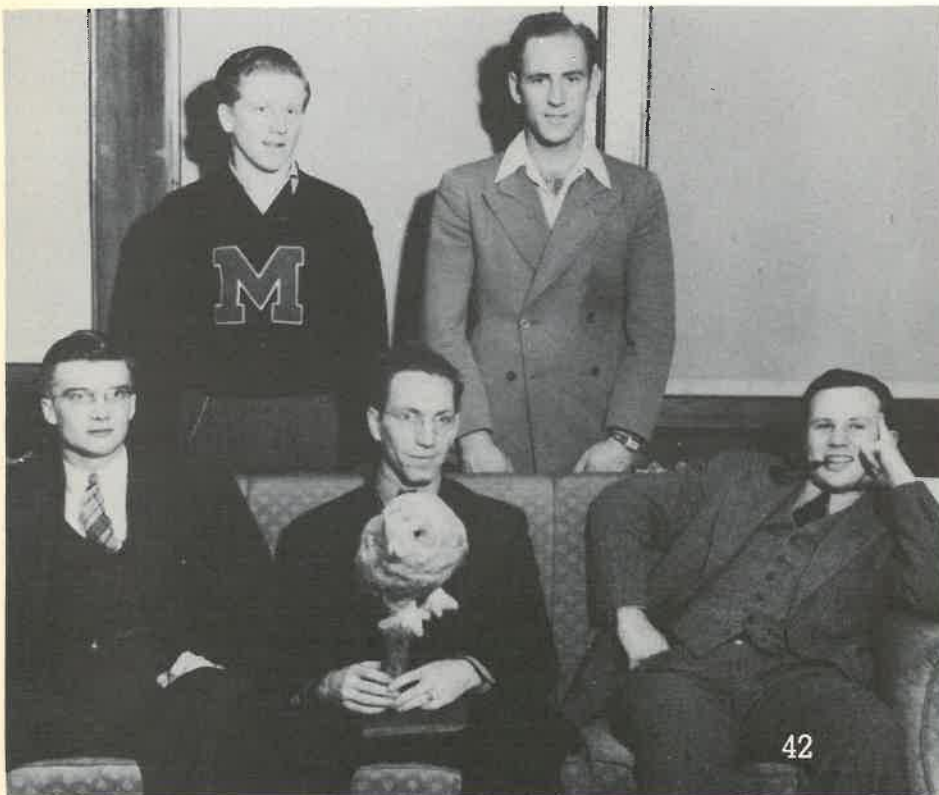

The 1941 season proved extremely unsuccessful for the luckless Dragon gridders, as attested to by the fact that they lost all seven games on their schedule. For Ed Hammer and Dr. E. M. Spencer, acting as head coach and assistant, respectively, the results were not such a disappointment, however, because they hadn't entertained any ideas of "setting the world on fire" when they started.

All but two of the 1940 squad were lost by graduation or in the mobilization of the National Guard. These two men, Floyd Garven and Bob Fielder, had only seen limited service even then. More than three-fourths of the squad had never played college football. Of the twenty-five candidates, eight were freshmen, nine were sophomores, five were juniors, and three were seniors. With such limited playing experience, certainly no one would expect them to win very many games.

Considering all angles, too, it did seem that the squad was unlucky at times. On several occasions, if the breaks would have fallen on their side, the result might easily have been the opposite. But to quote Hammer and Spencer, "there's no use talking of what might have happened."

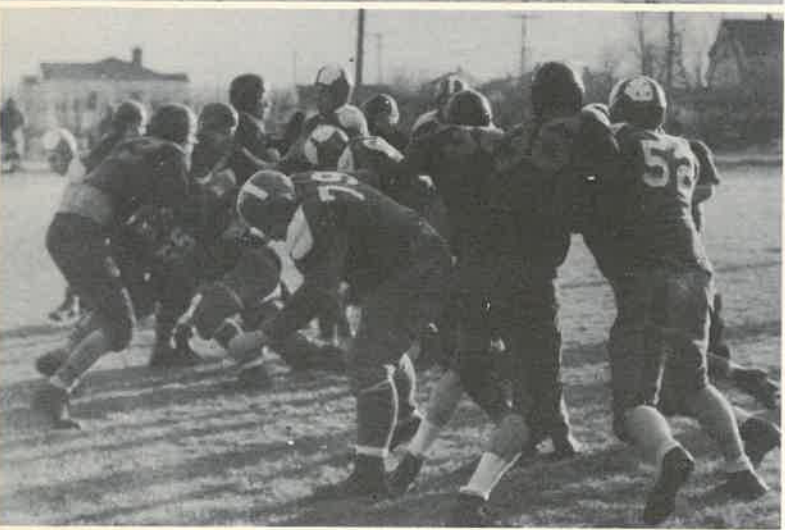
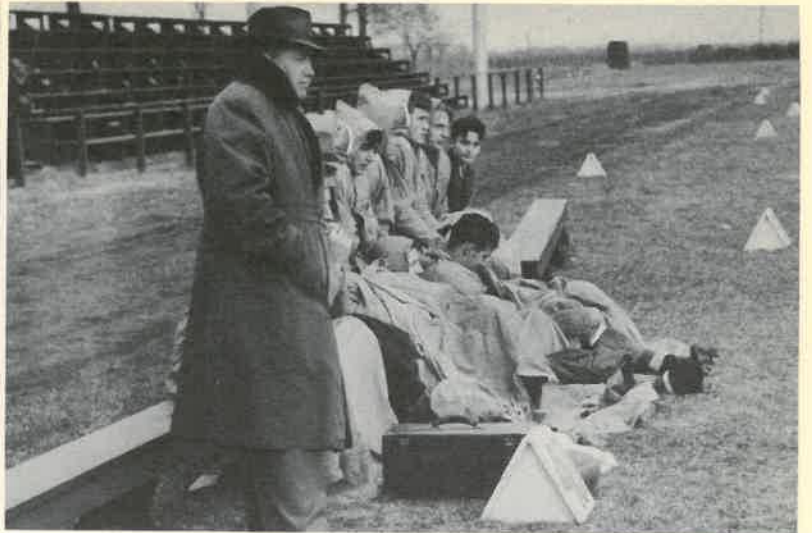

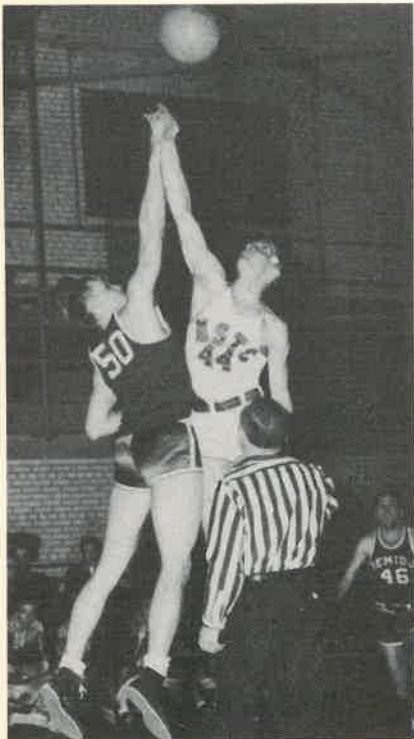

The Dragon cage squad enjoyed a comparatively successful schedule during the '41-'42 season, winning twelve games and losing eleven. This year's team finished in the same place in conference play as last year's — tied for third — but possessed a better won-lost, points scored, record.

Ed Hammer, completing his second year as head coach, lost seven of the members of last year's team and was faced with the prospect of building a team around a four-man nucleus. Three transfer students and a promising crop of freshmen lessened his worries, however. When the time arrived for assembling a travelling squad he found he had one senior, three juniors, four sophomores, and four freshmen — a comparatively young team in any man's league.

The season, as a whole, had both good and bad aspects. One of the good points was a 54-52 defeat handed the NDAC Bison, only the second time in the history of cage competition between the two schools that it had been done. And, of course, one of the bad points was the loss of the intra-city title to Concordia. The Cobbers won two of the three-game series, thereby taking possession of the trophy which the Dragons had won last year.

The Dragons didn't fare very well, due in part to their lack of practice just preceding the tournament. They lost to Valley City by a 32-31 score. They had defeated the Vikings by a 58-35 margin at Valley City just a week before.

Because the tourney was held during the holiday vacation, December 29, 30, and 31, it was not attended by many students. However, townspeople and fans from the schools that participated provided a satisfactory turn-out.

Track

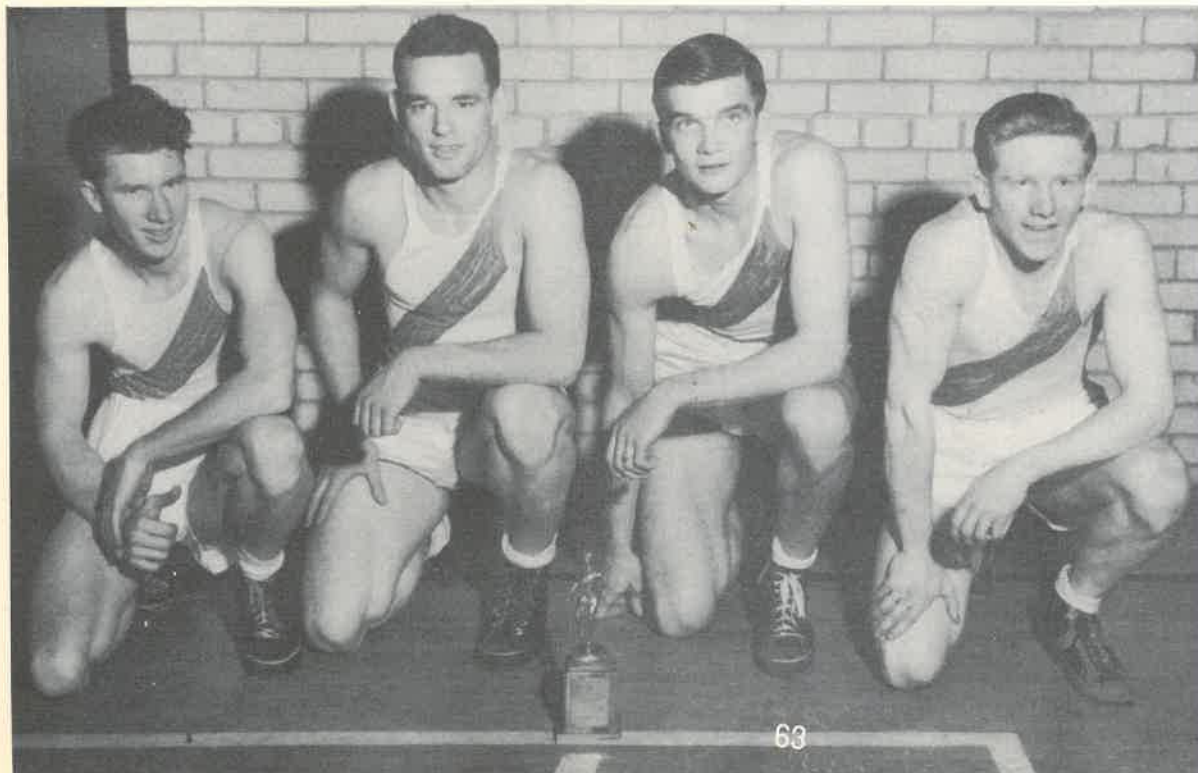


The track outlook is reasonably good this spring with four veterans returning for action. Three of last year's championship relay team are back. Fountain, the fourth member, transferred to NDAC this spring.

The 1941 team performed creditably in the league meet, but was hampered by its size. Nelson won the javelin throw for the second successive year and Fountain placed first in the 220 yd. run. Murphy garnered second places in both the 100 and 220 yd. dashes, these two and the relay making him second high scorer in the meet. Paulsen placed fourth in the high jump.

Among the freshmen candidates are Richard Forseth and Bernard McGuire, both of whom participated in the state high school meet last year. Forseth won the state pole vault title with a leap of 11 feet 10 inches, higher than the winning height in the conference meet.

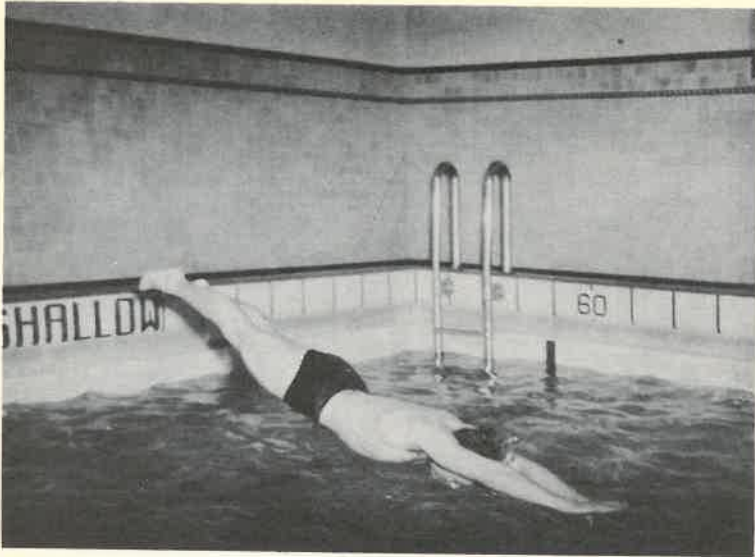

Swimming

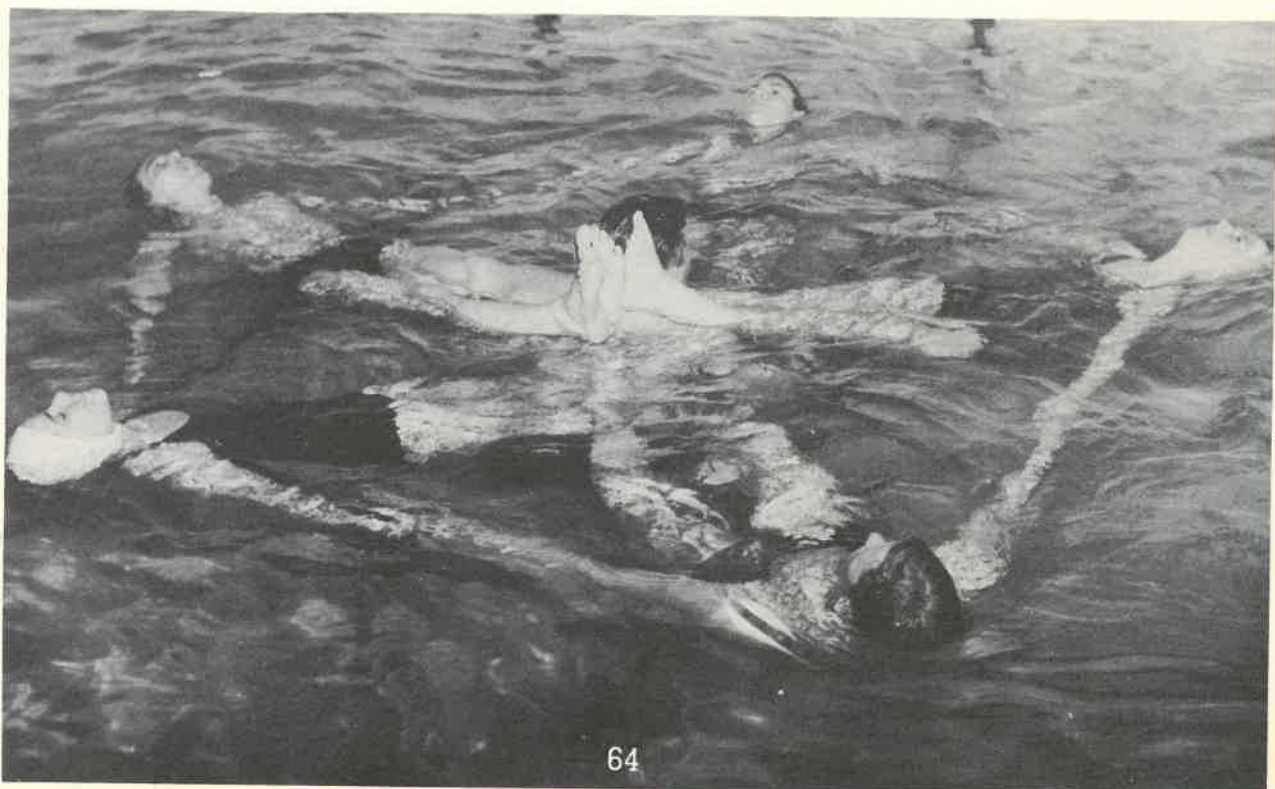

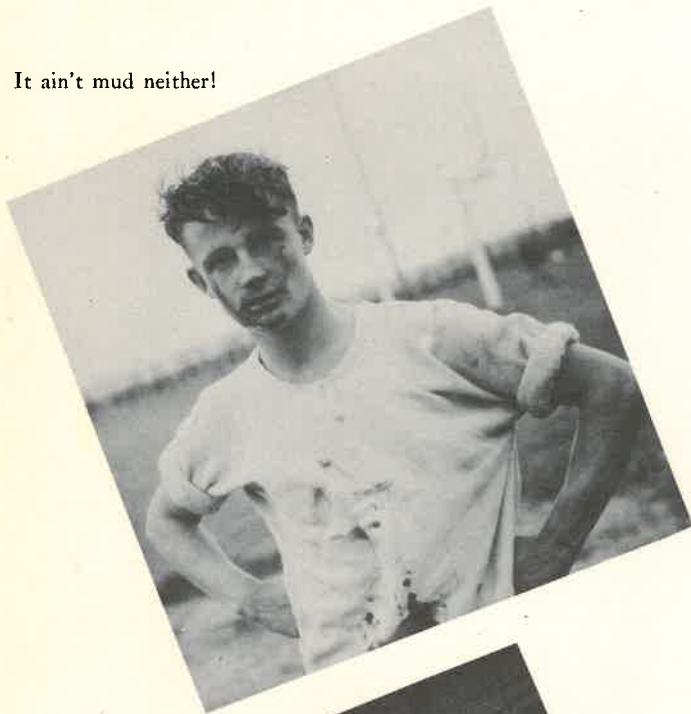

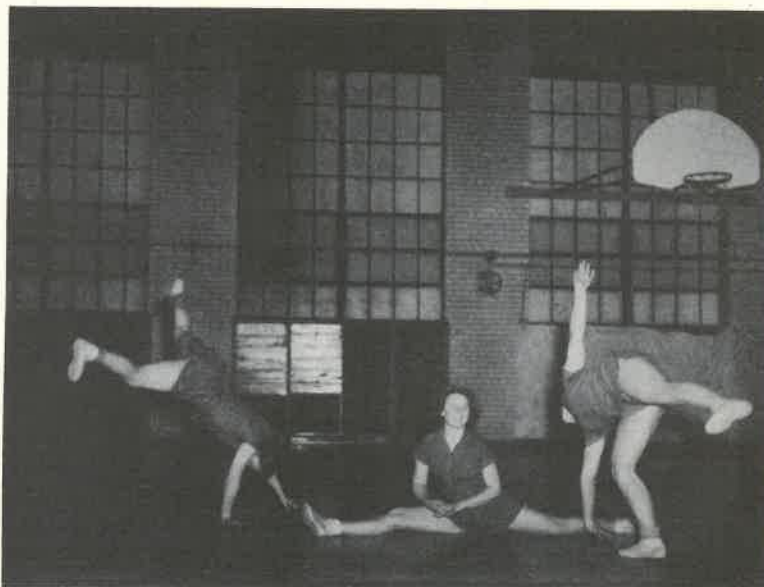
Women's Athletics
