# New records of Georgia Cerambycidae (Coleoptera: Cerambycidae)

# **Abstract**

Three species of Cerambycidae are newly recorded from Georgia, bringing the total to 257 species.

## Introduction

Although the cerambycid fauna of Georgia has received a great deal of attention (Fattig, P. W. 1947 Emory Univ. Museum Bull. 5: 1-48; Turnbow, R. H., Jr. and R. T Franklin. 1980. J. Georgia Entomol. Soc. 15: 337-349; R. F. Morris II. 1987 J Entomol. Sci. 22(2): 140-141 (April 1987), additional collecting has produced three species not previously recorded from the state. Each of these collecting records represents a significant extension of a previously recorded range. Addition of these three species brings the total state cerambycid list to 257 species. The county, date, collecting site, collector, and method of collection are given for each species.

Specimens discussed are in the author's collection.

#### Dryobius sexnotatus Linsley

## Stenocorus schaumi (LeConte)

# Purpuricenus axillaris Haldeman

Union Co., Coopers Creek W.M.A., road 4D, June 28, 1987, F. W. Skillman Jr. On *Hydrangea* flower. Previous distribution record: Eastern North America (Linsley, E. G. 1962. Univ. Calif. Publ. Entomol. 20: 1-188, pp. 105-108).
