# **TEXT4Baby**

Has your ECI Area become an outreach partner? Iowa officially became a TEXT4Baby partner in this national initiative that is endorsed by the Centers for Disease Control. Mothers receive three free text messages a week, timed to their due date or their baby's birth date, through pregnancy and up until the baby's first birthday. The messages address topics such as labor signs and symptoms, prenatal care, urgent alerts, developmental milestones, immunizations, nutrition, birth defect prevention, safe sleep, safety, and more.

## **Iowa Family Support Credentialing Program**

Family support programs are starting the process of re-credentialing after five years. The program just enrolled three new programs to start the process in the last month. A few programs have delayed enrollment which may cause some problems with their eligibility for ECI funds. There are 28 programs that have indicated that they will be ready for their peer review the spring of 2016. Those programs are being strongly encouraged to work at a faster pace as the Credentialing program does not have the ability to credential that high of number of programs within that short of a timeframe. ECI area directors and boards can encourage the programs they fund to not wait until 2016 to request their peer review as they may not be able to get it completed prior to July 1, 2016. The Credentialing program is funded exclusively with ECI professional development funds. The reduction in MIECHV funds has no impact on this project.
