Urban realities in developing countries

The global proportion of the urban population has already exceeded 50% and is constantly increasing. A substantial extent of growth and development in urban areas is "informal", located on the border or outside of planning and legal frameworks. In a world in which one out of three urban residents live in so-called slum conditions, the unprecedented scale, complexity and variety of both informal settlements and urban activities challenge our definition of development. Despite the existence of housing programmes, slum upgrading and governance reforms, urban informality persists and multiplies. The North-South Forum aims at addressing the interface between formality and informality in urban transformation in order to show the peculiarities and vitality of these hybrid development processes.
