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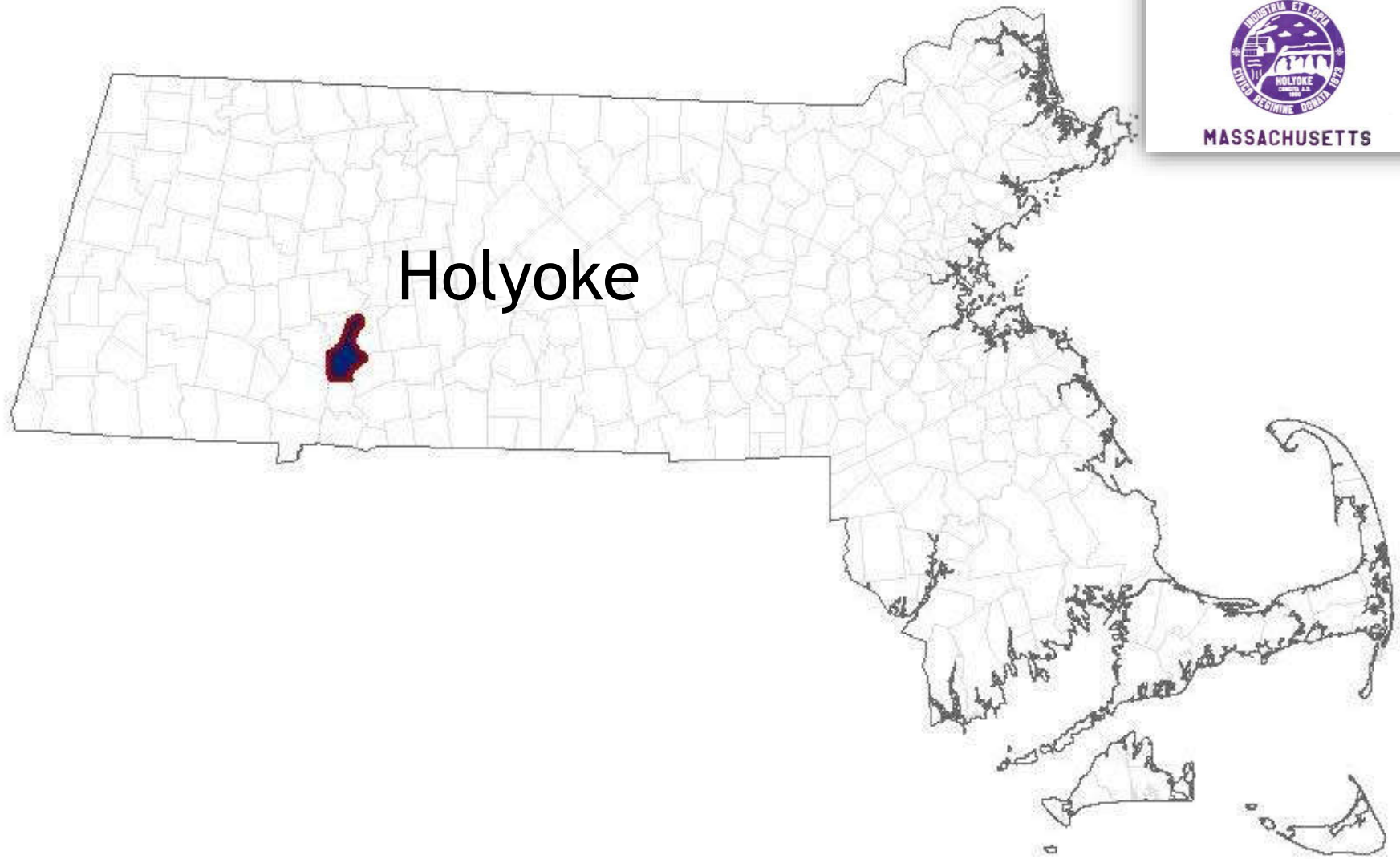

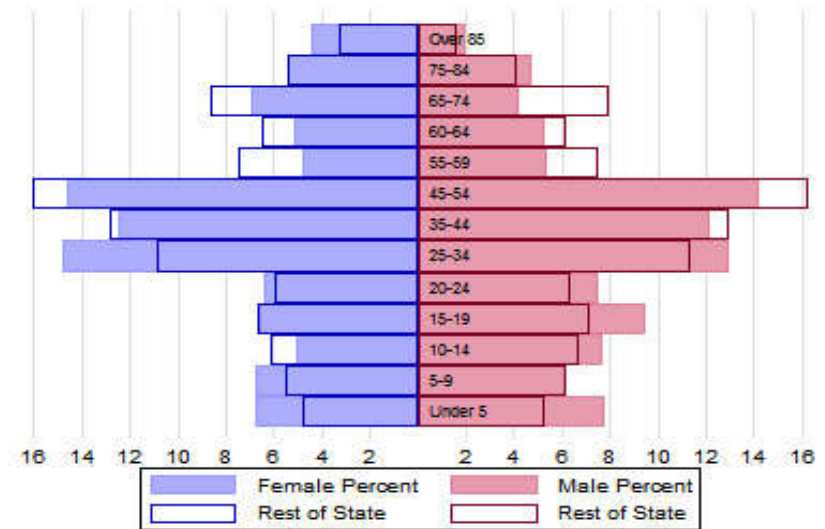

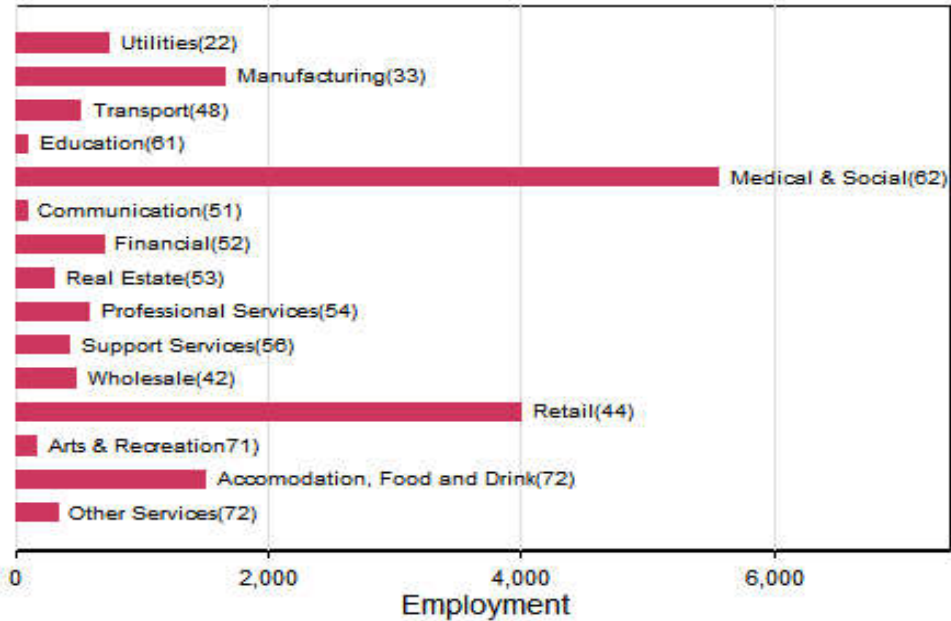

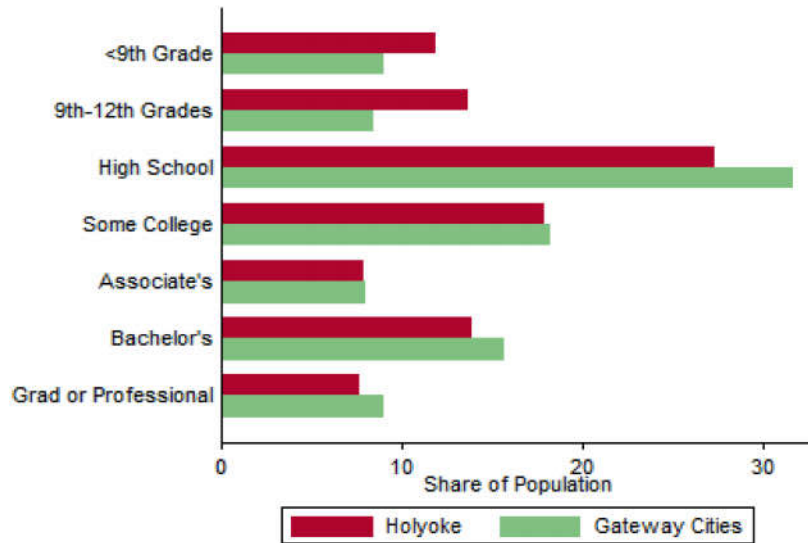
Employment by Major Sectors: 2012 (2-digit NAICS)

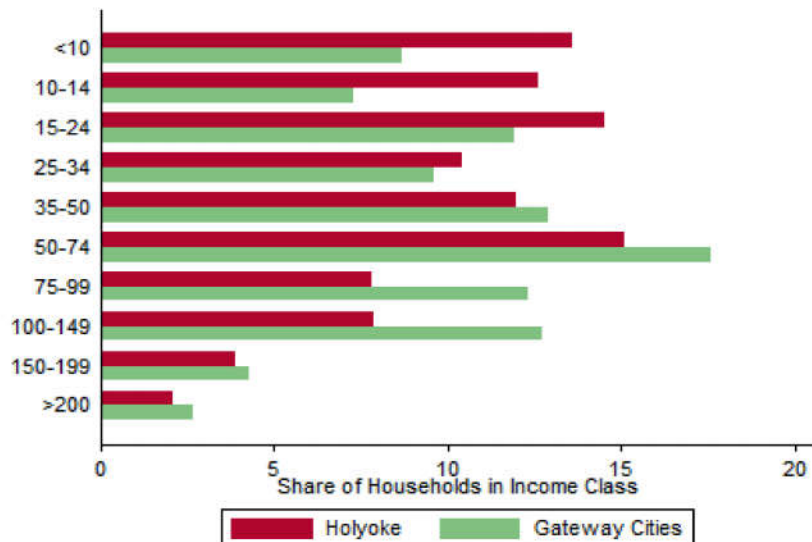
Educational Attainment of the Population Aged 25 and Older



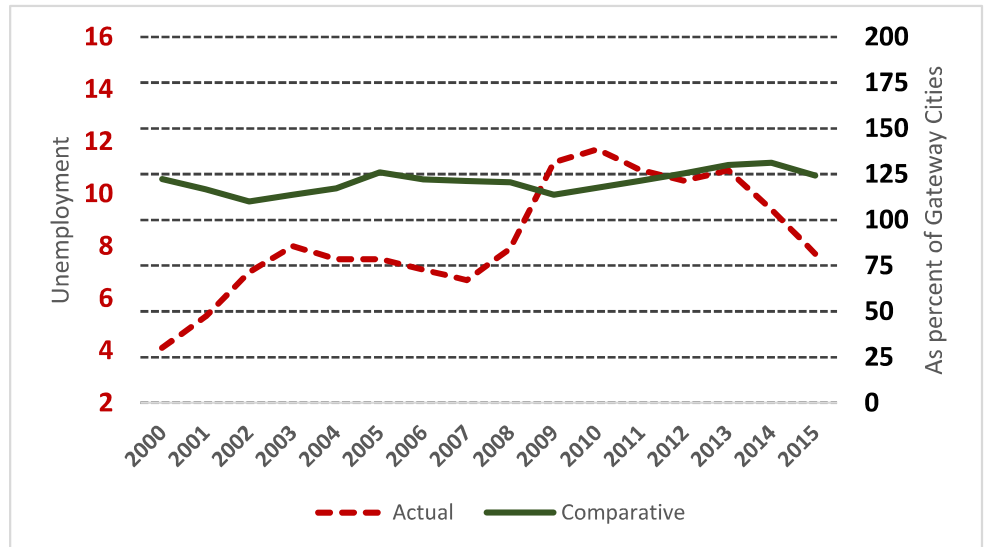

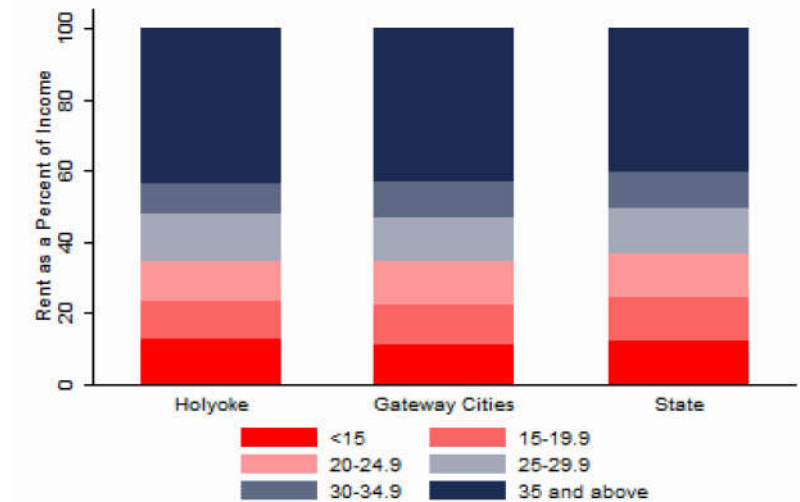

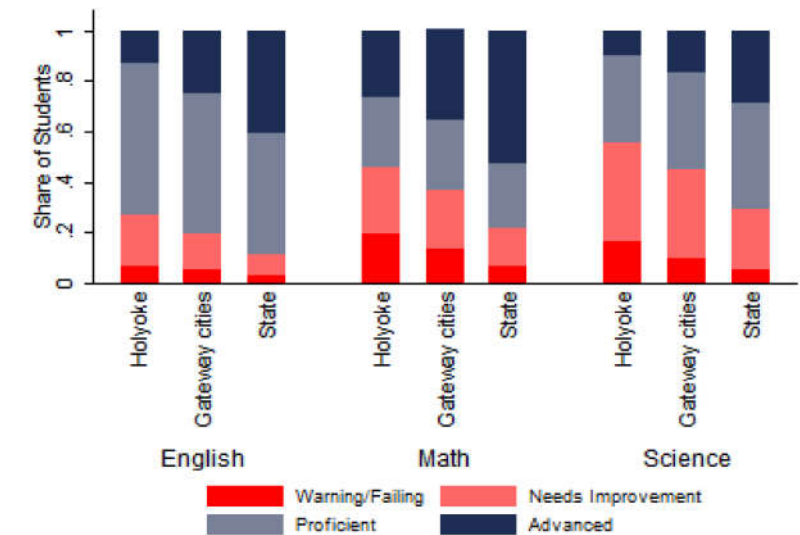

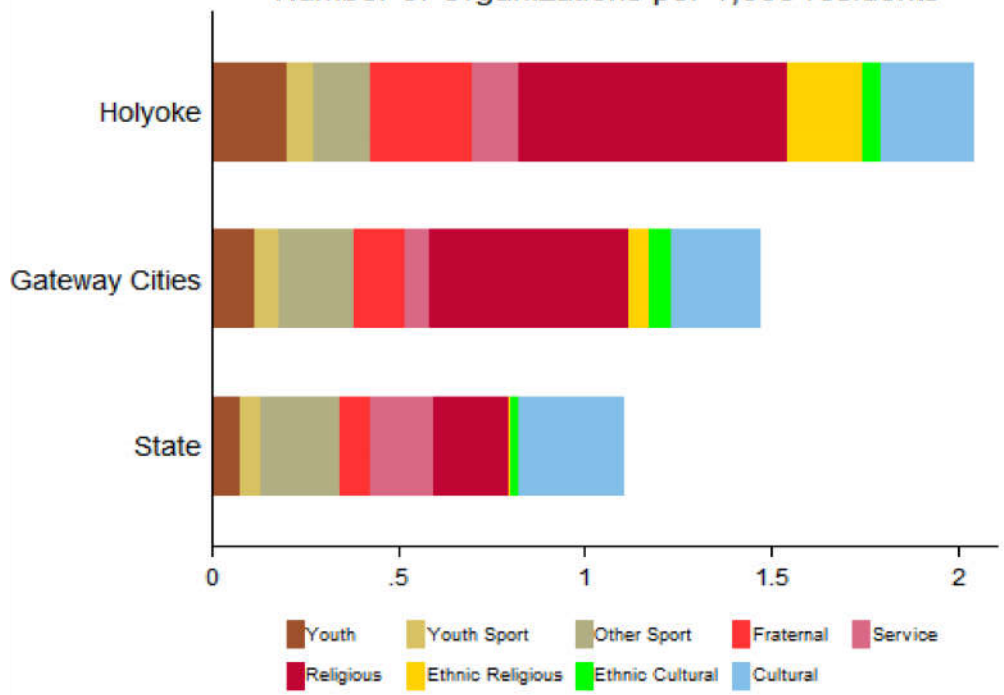
