

What is Consciousness?

- The condition of being aware
- Subjective experience of internal and external phenomena
- Central to understanding, meaning, and volitional choice
- Consciousness defines our existence



Theories of Consciousness

- Conventional scientific theories based on materialist-reductionist approach
- Emphasises complex computational-like activity occurring in brain
- Consciousness can only occur in the *presence* of neurological activity



Near-Death Experiences

What are Near-Death Experiences [NDEs]?

"...subjectively profound psychological experiences involving a combination of elements; where the boundaries of space, time and perception are typically transcended..."

Emotional Elements

- intense, overwhelming emotions
- cosmic unity and oneness

- Cognitive Elements
 - enhanced awareness/perception
 - rapid travel, often through a tunnel
 - life review

- Transcendental Elements
 - seeing a bright light
 - meeting deceased others

- Paranormal Elements
 - disembodiment
 - perception of future events

Who has NDEs?

- Usually people who have had a 'critical incident'
 - > heart attack, drowning, car accident, suicide, among others
 - 5-25% of cardiac arrest survivors
 - > 4-9% of general community members will report an NDE
- No specific demographic characteristics are associated with an NDE
- NDEs have been reported across the globe throughout history

What happen after an NDE?

- The person is usually profoundly affected and transformed
- Typical positive aftereffects include:
 - Ioss of the fear of death
 - increased love and compassion for others
 - increased 'thirst' for knowledge
 - change to underlying values and beliefs
 - less concern with materialism
 - greater sense of spirituality

What causes NDEs?

- Some suggest involvement of biological, psychological, and transcendental factors
- None of these theories accounts for totality of elements in NDE
- No empirical studies have established these factors are involved in or produce NDE

A thorn in the side

Out-of-Body Episodes

- Characteristics:
 - feelings of disembodiment
 - perception of physical body and surrounding environment from position external to the physical body
 - > perception of events not ordinarily perceived, due to physical condition

Paranormal Perceptions

- Characteristics:
 - non-local perception
 - Peak-in-Darien experiences

Complex Cognitive Abilities

- Characteristics:
 - Iucid, vivid perceptual experiences
 - ➢ life review

The Thorn Embeds Deeper

- Implications:
 - consciousness appears to persist in the absence of a physical body
 - consciousness appears to persist across time
 - consciousness appears to operate in the absence of / beyond the reaches of conventional sensory modalities
 - consciousness may be more advanced than we can currently perceive

Conclusion

- NDEs provide some compelling examples that contradict current conventional theories
- Rather than being a 'thorn in the side', NDEs could be used to propel the field of consciousness studies
