Justification for the ASC Center

- Caring about children and families
- No hidden agenda
- Reduce stigma
- Reduce barriers to access (e.g., transportation, financial constraints)
- Getting the necessary stakeholders involved

Evolving Service Model

- Go to where the youth are
- Serve at the pleasure of the school
- Reach out
- Provide access to resources
- Focus on issues that have mental health implications
 - Academic success
 - School connectedness
- Accelerate, expedite access to resources

Evolving Service Model

- Strong educational component
- For graduate students, vertical (and interdisciplinary) team model
- For school staff, weekly intra- and interagency collaboration

Core Features

- Multiple levels of supervision
 - Increased monitoring
 - Consultation
 - Violence and suicide risk assessments
 - Coordinated safety plans
 - Multi-layered accountability
 - Law enforcement integrated
