PREFACE

Like most Fryer Library Occasional Publications the present work is the product of co-operative activity between the Library and staff in another department at the University of Queensland.

Don Watson is a Lecturer in the Department of Architecture and has worked with the National Trust of Queensland. Judith McKay is a Research Assistant in the same department and also a consultant for a National Estate study of war memorials in Queensland.

In Queensland, as elsewhere in Australia, there has been a growing interest in the history of local architecture and the architects who contributed to the built environment. These developments have been reflected in the research activities of the Department of Architecture which has, for instance, attracted Heritage Commission grants. For the same reasons several theses have explored aspects of local architectural history.

Research must be based on documents and, since teaching departments are not well equipped to act as custodians of primary materials, the Library has extended its collecting to architectural documents and drawings of local historical interest. Inevitably this has led to a more active and rewarding relationship between the Department and the Library.

The Library is pleased to be able to make information about the history of Queensland architects more widely available through this publication.


Derek Fielding University Librarian addresses listed for private practices are generally office addresses. In some cases, however, a suburban Brisbane address may indicate a home rather than office address.

Many firms, e.g. Eaton and Bates, had extensive regional and statewide operations.

INTRODUCTION

Purpose

This publication has been compiled to meet some of the documentary needs of architectural researchers and others working in associated areas. Among other objectives it proposes:

- to make possible the systematic investigation of the work of architects in Queensland, leading eventually to the production of a biographical dictionary of Queensland architects;
- to increase awareness of the large number and major contribution of architects working throughout Queensland; in particular as a counter to the popular belief that the colonial building tradition of the state is primarily vernacular;
- 3. to draw attention to the widespread distribution of architects throughout the state and to the greater mobility within the profession than is usual today;
- 4. to aid in the attribution of buildings to individual architects or firms of architects:
- 5. to partly fulfil Queensland's contribution to a proposed Australian Bicentennial Architecture Project.

The project attempts to identify architects who have worked in Queensland from the time of the first convict settlement up to 1940. Information about the early period is sketchy and the compilers wish to stress that they have not sought to compile an exhaustive listing but have tried to consult all readily available sources. The only work of a comparable nature is a section of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects' publication *Buildings of Queensland* published by Jacaranda Press in 1959. This section was based on an unpublished manuscript prepared by J.V.D. Coutts, 'Early Oueensland Architects'.

Scope and Format

The directory includes architects working in private practice, for government, and, where information is available, as employees of architects in private practice or of companies. Regrettably, the lack of records has meant that the identification of non-government employees has not been comprehensive.

Entries are arranged alphabetically under the name of the architect or architectural firm and detail whatever information is available relating to:

- i. the locations in which the architect/architectural firm operated;
- ii. registration with governmental authorities;
- iii. membership of professional organisations;
- iv. educational qualifications;
 - v. participation in exhibitions of works (whether specifically architectural or of a more general artistic nature);
 - vi. relevant biographical data.

The information is generally presented in one chronological sequence.

A locality index which refers the reader to architects/architectural firms who maintained an office within each locality follows the main alphabetical sequence.

Major Sources

The major sources consulted were:

Pugh's Almanac, 1859-1927; Post Office directories, 1868-1940; Roll of the Queensland Institute of Architects, 1888-1929; Roll of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects, 1929-1940; Register of the Board of Architects of Queensland, 1929-1940; Staff lists published in Queensland Parliamentary Papers, 1859-1940.

While the bulk of the information was derived from these sources, a very much larger range of directories, almanacs, year books, newspapers, registers, and government, institutional and private records were consulted. Most of these are listed separately under *Notes on Use* together with details about the scope of the individual sources.

NOTES ON USE

The single most difficult task in compiling this directory has been to assemble some criteria for determining who should be included. In the early days, professional boundaries were not as clearly defined as they are today, when government and professional bodies maintain records which enable a check to be easily made. In general, individuals and firms have been included if at some stage they were described as architects, even if on other occasions they were described as builders, engineers, or even auctioneers or agents, etc.

The Register of Architects Qualified to Practise in Queensland established under the Architects Act of 1928 is not necessarily a comprehensive guide to architects practising in the state, particularly to those working as employees. The intention of the compilers has been, above all, to identify persons who are likely to have been the designers of buildings, even if not specifically using the title of architect. Categories of qualifications which entitle registration under the Architects Act of 1928 are contained in Section 15.1 of the Act numbered (a) to (g). That category which applies to a particular architect is noted in his or her entry. Summarized briefly, the qualifications are:

- (a) has passed the examination of the Board;
- (b) has qualified in an approved Queensland school of architecture;
- (c) has completed at least 5 years training, commencing before the date of the Act, in the office of an architect, government department, local or statutory authority, or approved school, and has at least 2 years' practical experience:
- (d) has qualified in an approved school outside Queensland and has satisfied the Board as to his competence to practise, or that Registration under the Act would entitle a person to practise architecture without further examination in the place where the qualification was obtained;
- (e) has before 1.9.1928 practised as an architect in Queensland as a sole or main source of livelihood:
- (f) has completed at least 5 years' training to the satisfaction of the Board and who has passed examination by the Board;
- (g) has been for 2 years prior to 1.9.1928 a competent teacher of architecture to the satisfaction of the Board.

From 1928, registration with the Board was required for architects based in other States in order to practise in Queensland. Between 1859 and 1928, non- Queensland architects have been included in this directory only if they had a Queensland partner or branch office. Temporary removal from the Register (for example, for the non-payment of annual dues) has not been noted.

In collecting the data for this directory, the compilers have had to consult a wide and very diverse range of documentation. There were some inconsistencies between the sources consulted. Many can not be resolved because there is no authoritative source, and the judgement to be made must be in some degree subjective. The main guidelines used by the compilers are:

- if the inconsistency lies between a *Post Office Directory* and *Pugh's Almanac*, the information in the *Post Office Directory* has been preferred;
 spelling has generally been standardized to the form most commonly used if there is no other authoritative source:
- architectural firms are listed under the working names most regularly used;



In both A and B, sections searched include general architect trade lists, architects listed in the directories for individual country towns and advertisements. Architect trade lists date from 1865 in *Pugh's* and from 1874 in the *Post Office Directories*. Information on country practitioners is less adequate for the 1860's and 1870's. Country trade lists date from 1877 to 1919 and in 1926/7 in *Pugh's* and from 1883/4 in *Post Office Directories*. Inclusion in both A and B is subject to information supplied by local contributors. For instance, architects practising in Mackay are entirely omitted from the trade lists in *Pugh's*.

The general alphabetical listings in the *Post Office Directories* have been searched only for the period prior to the introduction of trade lists. Although continued searching may have identified other architects, who, possibly as employees might not have been listed elsewhere, comprehensive searching was not feasible. For one year (1890) in which this was done, very few additional names were found, possibly resulting from the frequent omission of occupations and non-householders, such as the many persons living in boarding houses. Because of the deficiencies in the early directories, information from some contemporary newspapers has also been used for the period to 1875.

Trade lists often group without specific identification related occupations, such as architects, engineers and surveyors. Cross referencing also occurs between architects and surveyors or engineers. Only where architect occurs in the heading has the list of persons been included. Where other information identifies such persons as engineers or surveyors, they have been mostly excluded after 1870. The occupation given for the same person can vary from year to year or between *Pugh's* and the *Post Office Directories* for the same year. The principle adopted has been to include where in doubt.

Country trade lists occasionally confuse other occupations, in particular agents and auctioneers, with architects, though there are known cases of architects also having been real estate agents. Queries have been added to the persons generally known to have been agents or auctioneers but who are listed as architects for a short time only. In remote localities persons who called themselves architects often filled a variety of occupations.

Dates given in directories are often at least a year out, as a result of delay between the compilation of trade lists and the publication or title date. For example, *Pugh's* for 1876 was published on 31 December 1875. The discrepancy can be greater where the lists are not, as seems to have been the case in some years, revised annually.

C. Journals

Staff lists were consulted under the following headings: Department of the Colonial Architect, Colonial Architect, 1848–1860; Clerk of Works, Moreton Bay, 1857–1860.

New South Wales Calendar and General Post Office Directory. Sydney: Stephens and Stokes, 1832.

Government staff lists for penal establishments were consulted.

For the period prior to 1859, only those appointments which may have entailed building and related administrative duties in what is now Queensland have been listed.

Comprehensive searching has been confined to those agencies listed above, though individual careers have been traced to or from other agencies when necessary.

Some persons who had long careers in the office of the Surveyor-General have been included for the period in the 1860's only, and their careers left incomplete. These persons frequently had the necessary skills to design buildings, and in the absence of other trained persons at this early time, it seems probable that they did so.

The identification of architects employed by the Queensland Government Railways is difficult prior to the 1880's. The designation of Architectural Draftsman is recorded for the first time in 1881, long after construction of railway buildings commenced on a large scale, and the term was used only sparingly thereafter during decades of considerable railway building activity. Railway employees have been included on the basis of seniority, length of service and other professional activities.

C. Australian Government

(i) Architects in the Public Service

Lists of Permanent Officers of the Commonwealth Public Service. 1906-1917; 1919-1927; 1933; 1935; 1937.

Under the Department of Home Affairs (later Works and Railways) the heading consulted was: Public Works Branch, Queensland, 1907–1927.

Under the Department of the Interior the heading consulted was: Works and Services Branch, Oueensland, 1933–1937.

Commonwealth buildings in Queensland were maintained and constructed by the Queensland Department of Public Works from 1901–c.1924. By 1940 the State was again co-operating with the Commonwealth in the construction of the Allied Works Council's wartime projects. An account of administrative arrangements can be found in an article entitled 'Australian Government Administration of Works and Housing' which was published in the Australian Department of Housing and Construction's *First annual report*, 1973–74, Canberra, 1974.

(ii) Architects Commissioned by the Government

Reserve Bank of Australia, Archives. [Letter to D. Watson, 31 March 1982]. The letter details the architects engaged for the War Service Homes scheme in Queensland. (Housed in Fryer Library).

Commonwealth Department of Housing and Construction. War Service Homes Jubilee 1919–1969. Canberra; 1969.

As agent for the Commonwealth Government, the Commonwealth Bank administered the War Service Homes scheme throughout Australia from 1919–1920. The Bank's architects, J. and H.G. Kirkpatrick, opened an office in Brisbane and engaged private architects as supervisors in country areas. The succeeding War Service Homes Commission did likewise, but its architectural staff lists for Queensland are believed to be not extant.

D. Oueensland Local Government

Blue Book of Queensland, 1861-1867. Municipal lists published during these years were consulted.

Pugh's Almanac, 1860-1890

Queensland Post Office Directories, 1860-1890. The municipal and towns directories, municipal councils, divisional boards as well as the directory listings for Brisbane and country were consulted.

Details of local government employment are included irregularly in *Pugh's Almanac* and the *Post Office Directories*. This information has been indexed to 1890 and the names of employees included selectively on the basis of position held, early date of employment, the size and remoteness of the locality/municipality and on other information concerning the employee's career. Again the principle adopted has been to include when in doubt.

ABBREVIATIONS

A. GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

For reasons of economy and simplification, abbreviations of the names of government agencies, educational institutions, exhibiting organisations, and professional qualifications and associations have been used in the entries for architects and firms. In most cases the abbreviations are straightforward contractions of a single name or qualification. The abbreviations for some government agencies, however, embrace complex administrative changes, particularly in controlling departments and in minor changes to the name of an agency even though its functions remained substantially the same. Major administrative changes have been indicated in the following explanations of abbreviations, but the compilers have not attempted here to compile detailed administrative histories of all the government agencies which employed architects. For the exact title and administrative arrangements for an agency for a given year, readers should refer back to the official records.

In the following explanations of abbreviations, semi colons have been used between successive names of controlling departments, then a colon indicates an agency within the preceding department/s. Successive changes to the name of an agency are also punctuated by semi colons.




