CAMPBELL-PRAED, Mrs 1851-1935

Papers, consisting of notes for and manuscripts of printed books, correspondence and financial papers. 6 feet. Mrs Campbell-Praed née Rosa Murray-Prior, the daughter of a Queensland squatter and postmaster-general, was a well-known novelist in England c. 1880-1916. A thoroughly practical business woman, she was also interested in the occult and one of her books, Nyria, set in Ancient Rome, was based on information she believed had been transmitted, through a clairvoyante, from the actual heroine. As an old woman she set about preparing a new edition of this, and the notes concerning it are more full than for others.

Papers, consisting of notes collected for article on centenary of Buderim, and manuscript of article. 20 pages.

GLASSEY, Thomas, 1844-1936

Papers, including 5 newspaper cutting books, photographs, broadsheets, notes for speeches, also letters of condolence received by Mr Glassey's family at his death, and letters and cuttings relating to erection of obelisk to his memory. [Thomas Glassey was the first Labor representative in the Queensland Parliament, 1888, and was a Senator in the first Federal Parliament.]

HURLE, Henry Hartley Charles

King by the residents of Mount Gravatt and Rochdale; Presented to Adolphus Marcus Hertzberg, Esq.; by residents of Roma and Maranoa 1886, by Members of Board of Management of Brisbane Hebrew Congregation 1896, from Members of Hebrew Congregation on 50th anniversary of his arrival in Queensland 1917, from Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board to Mrs Hertzberg on her husband's death, 1917.

McDOWALL BROTHERS, TOOWOOMBA

WHISH AND ROE FAMILIES

Papers, including Diary of Captain Whish, 1855-89; Diary of Maud Whish, 1879; Diary of voyage to Australia; literary sketches; book of newspaper cuttings relating to education, by Dr. Stanley Roe; Reminiscences (typescript) of Dr. A. S. Roe; Captain C. B. Whish was a pioneer of sugar-growing in Queensland. Dr Roe, his son-in-law, was headmaster of the Brisbane Grammar School 1876-1909, and father of Dr A. S. Roe who was the first Queensland Rhodes Scholar.

WINDSOR STATION

Diaries, 1885-90, compiled by Henry H. C. Hurle. Presented by Mr R. E. Hurle, of Charters Towers. Mr H. H. C. Hurle took up Windsor Station in 1884.
