Animal found on side of highway @ ~ 1100 hrs.  
Fairly fresh. Very little odor. Fleas still alive  
on animal.



Animal has a white-tipped tail! 

Several fleas brushed out of coat.

Damage to animal by vehicle - Both front limb humeri  
broken. ~~Right~~ Left rear femur broken. Lower jaw  
broken + nasal bones broken.

No heartworms seen. Lungs a healthy pink + dark red  
mottling. No worms seen in trachea or lungs/bronch-  
ioles. A few worms (nematodes) seen in stomach.

Contents of stomach saved in jar.
