Native American Lands Where Tribes Have Rights or Potential Rights to Colorado River Water





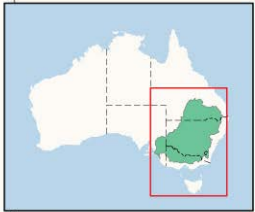
