School Direct applicant figures 2013

The National College for Teaching and Leadership (NCTL) manages applications for the School Direct Initial Teacher Training (ITT) programme through its online application portal. School Direct is available in primary and secondary schools across England and applications can currently be submitted for up to three training places which will be considered in parallel by schools and their accredited ITT partners. Applicants who have applications rejected can apply again to School Direct as they are allowed to have up to three 'live' applications in the system at any one time.

There are two routes available within the School Direct programme: the School Direct Training Programme is paid for by the trainee, costs qualify for student loan support through the Student Loans scheme. It offers high quality graduates the opportunity to train in a school; the School Direct Training Programme (salaried) is an employment-based route available to graduates with three years' work experience who are paid a salary while they train.

Applications for teacher training places not covered by the School Direct scheme are made through the Graduate Teacher Training Registry (GTTR) or are submitted directly to the ITT provider. These applications are not covered by the NCTL system and are therefore not included in these statistics.
