Readership Distribution

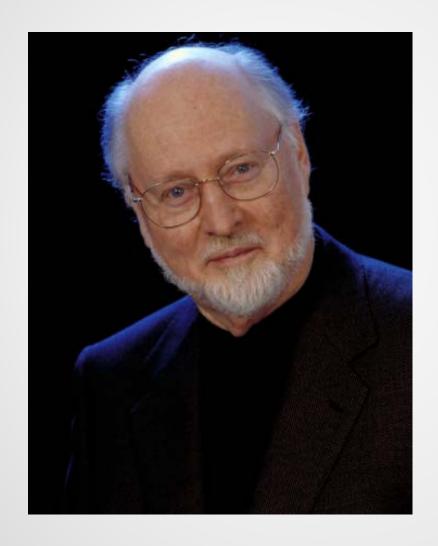


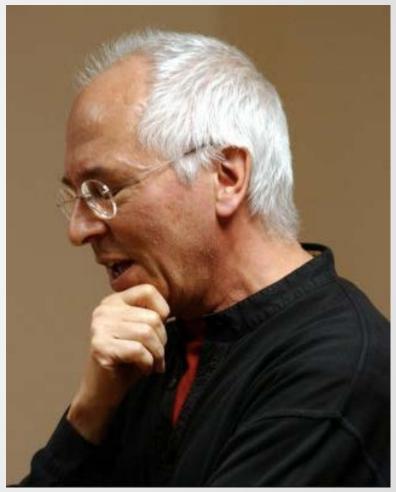
