New wheat, from Culpeper county, was sold in Alexandria, last week, at \$1.60 per bushel.

Pace, the recognized president of San Domingo, defeated Cabral's forces at San Juan, on the 4th instant. A considerable portion of the town was destroyed.

From the accounts we have seen from various sources, it is evident that the wheat crop of this State will be nearly an average one in quantity.

Judge Strong, of Philadelphia, has decided several cases, recently involving the constitutionality of the income tax, in which he sustained the tax, and ordered that judgments be entered for the defendants.

Germany has made an imperative demand for the immediate payment of the first instalment of the indemnity, which it was agreed should be paid within thirty days after the re-establishment of the Versailles authority.

It is now apparent to all impartial minds, North and South, that the facts elicited by the Ku-Klux investigation are mainly adverse to those who were instrumental in raving the bill passed.
