



The Warbler is a fine record of your past year at Eastern Illinois University.


As time passes the pictures and text will bring back many memories.


WORKING THEIR WAY














Cheerleaders

Netters Share Conference Championship

Coach Rex V. Darling's netters emerged successfully in every conference match during the regular season and tied for first place with Illinois Normal in the conference meet held at Charleston. Eastern lost only twice during the season. The Panthers were beaten decisively only once, 8-1, this coming at the hands of the University of Illinois. The other defeat was a thriller with Western Michigan, 5-4. The team gained strength with each encounter and finished the season by blanking five of their last seven opponents. Point winners for Eastern in the IIAC meet were in the No. 1, No. 2, and No. 6 spots, by Dennis Konicki, Clark Nelson, and Phil Stuckey, respectively. The team, composed mainly of promising underclassmen, lost only two men through graduation, Lloyd Ludwig and Phil Stuckey. Stuckey played in the No. 6 slot and Ludwig was lost to the squad with a leg injury for most of the season.

For Coach Rex Darling the successful 1957 season came as the direct result of tedious planning and long hours of practice sessions. That, in addition to the effects of his latest invention. The "brainstorm" rates top spot in a long list of Darling "firsts." It is a form of elasticized tape that fits the gym floor in the exact dimensions of a regulation tennis court. The floor is specially marked to provide for setting up and taking down of the makeshift courts in a matter of a few minutes. This serves to combat the perennial weather jinx that hampers many squads in early spring.

When quizzed as to the 1958 prospects, Darling simply flashed his patented smile and began expounding on his favorite subject, Eastern's 17 multicolored courts.

"To my knowledge, our courts are the only ones of their kind at any college or organization in the country." The surface, composed of layers of a rubberized element, will minimize skidding and eliminate "bad hops."





Individual statistics for the season show Konicki with the best record at 16-3. Following came Nelson with a 14-4 mark, Sims 12-3, Woodfall 12-4, Risley 10-4, and Stuckey, the lone senior finished with 6 wins against 3 losses.

As a team, the netters won 73 games while dropping 18 in 15 meets. In doubles competition, the squad won 26 games and lost 22, for an overall total of 99 wins and 40 losses. These figures include the regular season play, the IIAC tournament and the NAIA National Championships.

Conference champions Konicki and Nelson, who combined to form Eastern's No. 1 doubles team, traveled to Lamar State College of Technology last June to participate in the National NAIA tennis tournament. As a team they dropped their second round match to topseeded Stan Ellis and Aaron Johnson of Pepperdine. Konicki reached the third round in the singles before bowing out, and Nelson was outpointed in his first encounter.







Baseball Hopes Dampened by Weather


Hampered by unpredictable spring weather and a general lack of effectiveness, the Panther nine found itself in seventh place in the IIAC Conference at the end of the season. The team got off to a rousing start by downing its first two opponents by one-sided margins. They were then caught in a slump which continued throughout the season. An inexperienced mound staff and errors in the field contributed to the scoring of 93 runs by opponents, as compared with 85 runs scored by the Panthers. Eastern's Frank Wolf was named to the IIAC all-conference squad. Third baseman Gene Cornell, voted the season's most valuable player and honorary captain, was the only man lost through graduation. With the majority of the squad returning, the team can be expected to show considerable improvement this spring.

Coach Bill Rogers served in a temporary capacity for the spring quarter before returning to professional baseball. His successor is Jack Kaley, former Drake University head baseball coach. Kaley assumed duties at Eastern in September.

Golf at Eastern has long been classified as a minor sport, but even in such capacity it is looked upon as being somewhat neglected.





Coach "Pat" O'Brien's 1957 track team enjoyed another winning season, losing only one dual meet in four encounters. The Panthers' first defeat in a dual meet in four years was their loss to Normal, 66-65. Panther track prowess was evident both in the Bradley Relays and in the State College Meet with firsts in both events.

Graduation claimed many of the outstanding tracksters, but promising underclassmen make Eastern's future track hopes look bright. Those lost to the team through graduation were: Winston Brown, 100 and 220 yard dash; Neil Admire, javelin; Roger West and Everett Hardy, discus; Ray Fisher, shot; Bob Gilpin, quarter miler; Ray White, Eastern's top point-producer unable to compete in the IIAC because of a leg injury, also completed his eligibility during the 1957 season.

Eastern Michigan's Hurons, led by flashy sprinter Hayes Jones, took top team honors in the IIAC meet held at Lincoln Field, May 24 and 25. Eastern's tracksters proved to be the leading Illinois team in the meet but finished third with 27 1/10 points behind Eastern Michigan and Central Michigan. Eastern Michigan collected a total of 81 1/10 points.



Panthers Winless: Kohl Looks To Future

Coach Ralph Kohl's inexperienced Panthers staggered through a winless 1957 campaign, dropping all nine scheduled games. Hampered by the loss through graduation of lettermen from the 1956 team, the freshman dominated squad failed to come up to expectations, experiencing their first season without a victory since 1955.

In an effort to remedy the demoralized football situation, Kohl, who has been accustomed to winning ways throughout his football career as a player and a coach, is in the process of building what he hopes will ultimately be a formidable unit.

The 1957 squad, which averaged a scant 18½ years of age, made a better account of themselves than their hapless record indicates. The backfield, fortified with an abundance of intestinal fortitude, but hampered by an obvious lack of weight and experience showed flashes of brilliance under the almost constant onslaught of opposing linemen.

Paced by sophomore quarterback Verlon Myers, who led the IIAC in pass completions, and freshmen scatbacks Ken Calhoun and Perry Thomas, the Panther "cubs" battled both Western and Northern to a standstill, before depth and experience took their toll.

If the attrition rate from freshman to sophomore year is not as great as has been the case previously, a revitalized staff of gridmen will be on hand at Lincoln field in September.





Perry Thomas, who led Eastern halfbacks in rushing, is shown gaining short yardage around end. Running interference is end Bob Parrish.







In net ground gained rushing, Perry Thomas, who participated in only 4 games, led Panther backs with 157 yards.


Season totals saw Eastern behind opponents 540 yards to 2,283 yards in total net yards rushing.

In the penalty department, Eastern received 32 for a total of 315 yards. Opponents were penalized 73 times for a total of 727 yards.









Cagers Place Second in Conference Play

Despite the loss of regulars late in the season, Eastern's cagers finished the 1957-58 basketball campaign with the third best overall record in the state. The Panthers won 17 games and lost nine to finish behind unbeaten Western Illinois and Wheaton College, winners of the College Conference of Illinois.

The Panthers lost two regular forwards when Jerry Hise, junior from Decatur, suffered a severe sprained ankle in the second game with Southern, and B. J. Smith, junior from Gillespie, was dropped from the squad after the Illinois Normal game.

With Hise and Smith out, the Panthers went on to win their final three games of the season to share second place in the IIAC with Southern and Illinois Normal.


By virtue of their overall record, they were selected to represent the conference in the District 20 NAIA playoffs, where they fell victim to host Quincy College in the championship game for a berth in the NAIA National Basketball Tournament at Kansas City, Mo. Western Illinois, winner of the IIAC, received a direct bid to the tournament.

Pacing the cagers were John Milholland, senior from Westville, who added an all-time Eastern scoring record to his lengthy list of laurels, and Frank Wolf, senior guard from Benson, who was voted most valuable player by his teammates.

Milholland and Wolf placed third and fourth in IIAC scoring, Milholland finishing with an 18.6 average, and Wolf maintaining an 18.2 mark.

The two Panther guards, who are the only graduating seniors on the squad, were also named to the 1958 all-star team of the Interstate Conference.

The 1958-59 hopes rest mainly in the hands of Hise, Smith, and Ken Christensen, who this season made up in brawn what he lacked in height. Christensen, the smallest center in the IIAC, ranked high in the conference rebound department. "Christy" also showed the ability to be a high scorer as he developed an accurate jump shot to add to his tip-in finesse.



In his sophomore year, Milholland broke the single game mark with a total of 40 points. Last year his shooting earned him a spot on the NAIA all-tournament team.


The six-foot guard has been named to the all-star team of the Interstate Conference for three consecutive years, as he led Eastern to consistently high finishes.


Gymnasts Stagger Through Winless Season

With a year's experience under their belts, Coach Groves' charges figure to improve on their dismal 1958 finish.









Defending Champs Lead in 1958 Race





For individual sports, first and second place trophies are awarded. Individual medals are given to members of first place teams and winners of individual events.






