Bo Breda: Images in Beads

• April 25-May 25, Brainard Gallery

This exhibition of work by fiber artist Bo Breda features two- and three-dimensional fabric and beaded works. Breda uses an array of techniques to create richly textured wall hangings, some incorporating screened photos and bead embroidery, representational bead weavings with mythological or contemporary subjects, and bead-encrusted gourds with imagery based on spiritual themes.

Bo Breda is the Tarble's 2003 Illinois Arts Council Arts-In-Education artist-in-residence. She has an MFA in Fibers from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale and a BA in Linguistics from Queens College, New York. She is currently an assistant professor of fashion design at Mount Ida College near Boston. Her work has been exhibited in numerous group and solo exhibitions throughout the U.S. The exhibition and residency are made possible in part by grants from the Illinois Arts Council, a state agency; the Ruth and Vaughn Jaenike Access to the Arts Fund, and the Coles County Arts Council, with support from area schools and Tarble membership contributions.

21st International Children's Exhibition

• May 3-25, Main Galleries

This exhibition features two- and three-dimensional art by area students in grades K-12 along with works created by children from other countries. Held annually, the exhibition provides an opportunity for area art teachers to showcase their programs. Schools from eight east central Illinois counties are scheduled to participate in the exhi-

bition. Local schools who are represented in the show include: Ashmore, Carl Sandburg, Jefferson, Lerna, Lincoln, and Mark Twain Elementary Schools, and Charleston Middle and High Schools. Other area schools that are participating include Arcola Elementary School; Arthur Elementary School; Central A&M District #2; Chrisman Unit #6 Schools; Cowden-Herrick District #3A; Crestwood Grade and Junior High School, Paris; Effingham Junior High School; Franklin School, Mattoon; Kansas Unit #3 Schools; Lincoln School, Mattoon; Mattoon Middle and Senior High Schools; Neoga Unit #3 Schools; Oakland Unit #5 Schools; Okaw Valley District #302; St. Mary School, Mattoon; Stewardson-Strasburg Unit 5A Schools; Sullivan High School; Tower Hill School; Washington School, Mattoon; and Windsor Unit #1 Schools.

The international component of the 2003 exhibition is comprised of children's art from the Tarble Arts Center's collection. Organized in cooperation with the Art teachers of Charleston Community Unit #1 Schools, an awards reception is scheduled for Sunday, May 18, 1-4pm. Cultivating Creativity Awards Reception

May 6, 7pm

Everyone is invited to join in honoring the young artists represented in the 2002-2003 edition of *Cultivating Creativity: Consolidated Communications Children's Art Exhibit*. This year's exhibit presents 43 works of art representing an equal number of area schools. In recognition of their achievements the 44 young artists (one art piece was a team effort) will be presented with \$100 Savings Bonds from Consolidated Communications, the sponsor of the *Cultivating Creativity* exhibit program. Consolidated will also make donations of \$50 in support of each participating school's Art program. A joint project of the Tarble Arts Center and Consolidated Communications Inc., this is the ninth year CCI (formerly Illinois Consolidated Telephone) has sponsored the exhibit.
