FOR CHILDREN

Exploring Art (ages 4-5)

Instructor: Terry Hyder Mondays, 4:00-5:00pm, February 27-April 10

(Note: class will not meet on March 13)

Fee: \$20.00 for members, \$24.00 for non-members

Designed for the pre-school set, this class will offer students the opportunity to explore a variety of art media and processes. Each lesson incorporates the use of different materials including Model Magic, watercolors, and drawing media and the use of tools such as scissors and paint brushes.

Art Down Under (ages 6-8)

Instructor: Katie Voegel Saturdays, 9:30-10:45am, February 25-April 8 (*Note: class will not meet on March 11*) Fee: \$26.00 for members, \$32.00 for non-members

This class for young children will focus on the arts of Australia and New Zealand through a variety of 2-D and 3-D projects. Both traditional and non-traditional art media and tools will be used as students create works of art inspired by the natural world and based on art forms native to the region. **Registration deadline: February 22**

Painting: A Cultural Experience (ages 9-14)

Instructor: Katie Voegel Saturdays, 11:00am-12:30pm, February 25-April 8 (*Note: class will not meet on March 11*) Fee: \$32.00 for members, \$40.00 for non-members Based on painting styles from around the world, this class will introduce students to art traditions from Asia, Australia, and the Americas. Projects include Japanese Brush painting, Aboriginal paintings, and Mexican folk art paintings. Different techniques and tools will also be utilized. **Registration deadline: February 22**

FOR YOUTHS AND ADULTS

Portraits in Many Media (ages 12 and over)

Instructor: Kit Morice

Thursdays, 6:30-8:30pm, February 23-March 9 Fee: \$24.00 for members, \$30.00 for non-members

This short class will introduce participants to portraiture using a variety of media. After learning about facial structure and proportions, class time will be devoted to the creation of a series of portraits in pencil, charcoal, paint, and collage.

Woodland Quillwork on Birch Bark (ages 12 and over)

Instructor: Dorothy Bennett Tuesday, April 4, 6:30-8:30pm Fee: \$20.00 for members, \$24.00 for non-members

In this intensive workshop, participants will learn about the art of "embroidering" with Porcupine quills on birch bark in the Woodland Indian tradition. After seeing examples of quillwork, students will have the opportunity to create and execute their own design using dyed quills on birch bark.

FOR ADULTS (AGES 15 AND OVER)

Introduction to Soft Pastels (ages 15 and over)

Instructor: Anne Hughes

Mondays, 6:30-9:00pm, February 20-March 6

Fee: \$44.00 for members, \$52.00 for non-members

With an emphasis on process and techniques used with soft pastels, this short class will be a general introduction to the medium. Topics to be covered include additive and subtractive techniques, color, and developing personal subject matter. Class fees include a set of pastels for each participant.

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Commemorative Jewelry (ages 15 and over)

Instructor: Victoria Woollen-Danner Saturdays, 1:00-4:00pm, February 25-March 4 Fee: \$60.00 for members, \$72.00 for non-members This introduction to metalworking focuses on the use of simple hand tools and "cold connections" (no heat required) to create a piece of commemorative jewelry. Participants will design a piece of jewelry that expresses or interprets moments, people, or places of personal significance. Using copper, brass, and found objects, participants will learn how to cut out shapes, join pieces with riveting, wire, and jump rings, and add texture through embossing, stamping, and hammering.
