Producer Guy S. Little, Jr. With the opening on May 20th of Barefoot In The Park starring Tab Hunter, Producer Guy S. Little, Jr. is proud to begin his second decade of live theatre for central Illinois audiences. Long before Mr. Little opened the Grand Theatre back in 1957, he hoped and planned that someday he would have a theatre where musicals and plays could be presented. He got his first job in professional theatre as an apprentice at the Keene, New Hampshire Summer Theatre in 1951 and worked the two following summers at the Gateway Musical Playhouse near Atlantic City. After graduation from the University of Mi-ami, Mr. Little took graduate courses at Colum-bia University and The American Theatre Wing before returning to central Illinois in the spring of 1957 to look for a theatre location. Not having success locating a suitable theatre

Not having success locating a suitable theatre in any of the larger cities in downstate Illinois, Mr. Little decided to lease the movie house in his native Sullivan. Since the opening of *Brigadoon* on July 3, 1957, Mr. Little has pre-sented 100 major productions—both plays and musicals—featuring many outstanding stars and supporting casts from Broadway, Hollywood, TV and Opera. The first season ran nine weeks and had an attendance of 8,000. The Little Theatre-On The Square was open for twenty-five weeks last year and had an attendance of 80,000 . . . a most gratifying increase! In addition to his productions in Sullivan, Mr. Little manged the Piccolo Playhouse in Joliet and has had touring productions that have played theatres in Michigan. Ohio and the Chicago area. Mr. Little is often asked to open and manage other theatres in the midwest, but his devotion is to The Little Theatre-On The Square and Mayal audiences. Mr. Little works year around booking outstanding stars such as June Allyson, John Carradine, Peter Palmer, Rose-mary Prinz, Dennis Weaver, Robert Reed, John Payne, Margaret O'Brien, Julia Meade, Pat O'Brien, Linda Darnell, Marie Wilson, Eddie Bracken, Joe E. 





An example of how well she has achieved true stature as an actress is the fact that several years ago renowned director Elia Kazan selected Terry over all other aspirants for the important lead opposite Fredric March in Man On a Tightrope. which won her critical acclaim. Among Terry's many films are Mighty Joe Young, Gambling House, Daddy Long Legs, Shack Out On 101. Between Heaven and Hell, Bernadine, Beneath The 12 Mile Reef. A Private's Affair, City of Secrets, Black Spurs and Town Tamer. Her television credits embrace virtually every top program including Checkmate, The Red Skelton Show, Burke's Law, The Tonight Show. Bob Hope Chrysler Theatre, My Three Sons and Empire on which she co-starred with Richard Egan. Terry's latest films include Waco and A Man Called Dagger while TV audiences have seen her on Batman. Earlier this year, she was starred in The Pajama Game at one of the leading theatres in the East. Terry is married to Stuart Crammer, III, and they live with their two young sons in a beautiful home on a mountaintop overlooking a panorama of Beverly Hills and the Pacific.

GORDON McLENDON (Bill Page) could well be the most versatile talent in the entertainment world today. A graduate of Yale University and himself a former Golden Gloves boxer—he was voted America's Outstanding Football Announcer in 1951 by THE SPORTING NEWS. He has written, produced and acted in more than one thousand radio shows, all of them still in syndication. On the stage he has appeared as the male lead in road versions of such Broadway successes as Twentieth Century and The Reclining Figure, has co-produced three motion pictures and acted in a number of others. He is the author of a number of important reference books and has just just completed the scripts for two forthcoming feature films Tom Sawyer's Treasure and The Christmas Trip of Santa Claus, which he will co-produce with Sy Weintraub. For eight years, he has been under exclusive contract to United Artists to create, produce and often narrate that company's radio and TV campaigns for its major pictures, among them the James Bond series, The Guns of Navaronne, The Alamo, etc. Himself, the owner of America's largest chain of independent radio and television stations, he has been named one of America's Ten Outstanding Young Men by the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce, is one of the few entertainers for many years last year honored by the coveted annual award of the American Academy of Achievement along with Dr. Harold C. Urey, Dr. Edward Teller, DeWitt Wallace and others. In October in New Jork, he will receive the 1967 award as "Radio's Man of the Year."


