

PLANTS OF FLORIDA

Avicenniaceae Avicennia germinans (L.) L.

HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY: W of Tampa, SE of Oldsmar, on small peninsula between Double Branch Bay and Mobbly Bay, Upper Tampa Bay County Park, 8001 Double Branch Road; accessed S off Hillsborough Avenue (= C.R. 580) ca 1 mile E of the Pinellas county line. Mosaic of coastal mangrove swamp with Conocarpus erectus, Laguncularia racemosa, Rhizophora mangle and tidal swamp with Sarcocomia perennis, Sesuvium portulacastrum, Distichlis spicata, Sporobolus virginicus, Fimbristylis spadicea, Juncus roemerianus. Shrub or tree to ca 8 m, commonly only 2-3 m tall; flowers white. Lat. 28°0'52"N Long. 82°38'1"W.
