Growing in ponded area of wet prairie with *Asclepias incarnata*, *Aster lanceolatus*, *A. praealtus*, *Boehmeria cylindrica*, *Calamagrostis canadensis*, *Frechites hieracifolia*, *Leersia oryzoides*, *Ludwigia polycarpa*, *Lycopus americanus*, *Mimulus ringens*, *Oenothera pilosella*, *Penthorum sedoides*, *Persicaria amphibium*, *Proserpinaca palustris*, *Spartina pectinata*, etc. Perennial herb with pink flowers, plant creeping.
