*Phoradendron leucarpum* (Rafinesque) Rev. & M.C. Johnston

North Carolina: Swain County  
35.44643° North Latitude, -083.66627° West Longitude ± 26 feet (WGS84/NAD83)  
The Great Smoky Mountains National Park. Pikey Creek Watershed above Fontana Lake. Tuskegee Quadrangle. Elevation about 1755 feet. AT junction of Fontana Lake with Pikey Creek [=Pilkey Creek].

Growing in *Diospyros virginiana* (persimmon tree). Base of the persimmon was at this time inundated by Lake Fontana where Pikey Creek enters the lake. Growing attached to branch in crown of the tree.
