*Lysimachia terrestris* (Linnaeus) B.S.P.

Illinois: Iroquois County

40° 59' 06" North Latitude; 087° 32' 41.4" West Longitude

Iroquois County State Conservation Area. UTM 16, 454169mE, 4537022mN.

Donovan 7.5 minute quadrangle. 2 mile south and 7 to 10 mile east of St. Anne. Southeast corner of conservation area.

Growing in wet prairie community. Kankakee Sand Area of the Grand Prairie Natural Division. Growing with *Onoclea sensibilis*, *Thelypteris palustris*, *Phlox glaberrima*, and *Pycnanthemum* sp. Perennial herb with yellow raceme of flowers.
