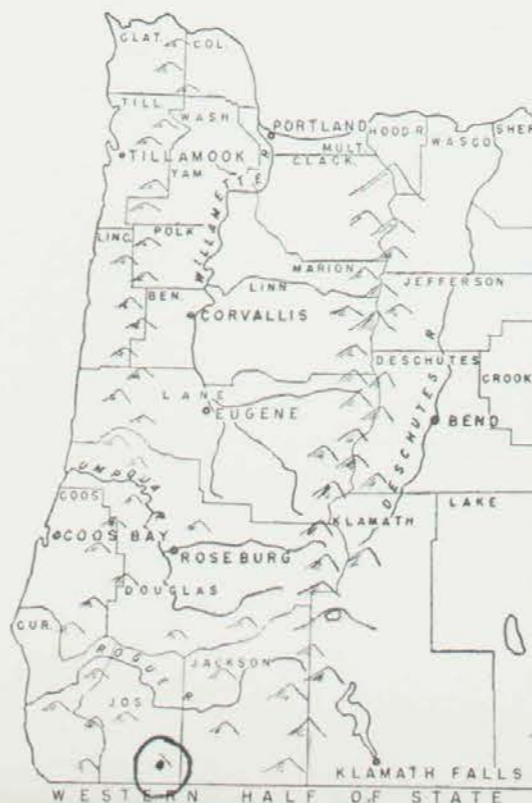
MONTIA PARVIFOLIA (Moc.) Greene

Slender stems from succulent rosette; flowers white.

Very common in rock clefts in coniferous forest zone; with *Lewisia*, *Sedum*, *Calochortus* & *Penstemon*; dry loam soil; elev. 5,500 feet.

JOSEPHINE COUNTY: north slope of Miller's Peak, about 6 mi. (airline) southeast of Oregon Caves; near *Cupressus Bakeri* grove. VII/8/1956
