The University of San Diego will be offering more than 80 courses over a 12-week period this coming summer. Of special interest to service personnel are offerings in the School of Business Administration which include Cost Accounting, Money and Banking, Personnel Administration, Production Management, Accounting Standards and Analysis, and Management Theory and Practice.

Courses are offered both days and evenings, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, and range from one-week symposia to eight-week courses in the School of Business Administration.

The Department of Political Science and International Relations is offering "Politics and Parties," "Arms Control and Disarmament," and "Theories of Causes of War."

The Department of History is making available Historic Site Archaeology at the Old Town State Park.
