Abstract

Awareness and usage of open educational resources (OER) in higher education is on the rise, thanks to OER advocates and digital repositories such as the Open Textbook Library, MERLOT, Cool4Ed, OER Commons, and more. But as the Open Education Librarian at the University of Arizona Libraries, I've encountered a variety of concerns from faculty and administrators about OER. These range from worries about content quality to the amount of time it takes faculty to adopt/adapt/create OER to the difficulty of finding OER in a particular subject (particularly for upper-division courses). Concerns also relate to academic freedom, campus bookstore relationships, copyright questions, confusion over Creative Commons licenses, and the technical difficulties of customizing digital OER. This presentation will share specific ways to address these concerns, resources you can share with faculty and administrators, and tools you can use to increase OER adoptions at your institution.

Opening the Door to OER

Open educational resources offer enormous possibilities for college students and professors, but much work remains in finding, curating and maintaining the curricular materials, Fernando Bleichmar writes.

The most common challenge that instructors who want to use OER experience: it's hard to find the best stuff.

OER quality is a mixed bag. Much of it is very good, but plenty of it isn't. For instructors, parsing the quality of OER content and assessments takes time away from the countless other things they have to do to prepare their course. Forty-five percent of faculty members polled in a recent study said they couldn't find quality OER resources for their subject areas.

With tens of millions of open educational resources available, how can an educator select and use OER effectively? Helping educators successfully implement OER requires that we solve the curation issue in a way that preserves what draws instructors to open content in the first place: its flexibility and affordability.

Ongoing Maintenance

A hard truth for instructors: maintaining OER is a full-time job.

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

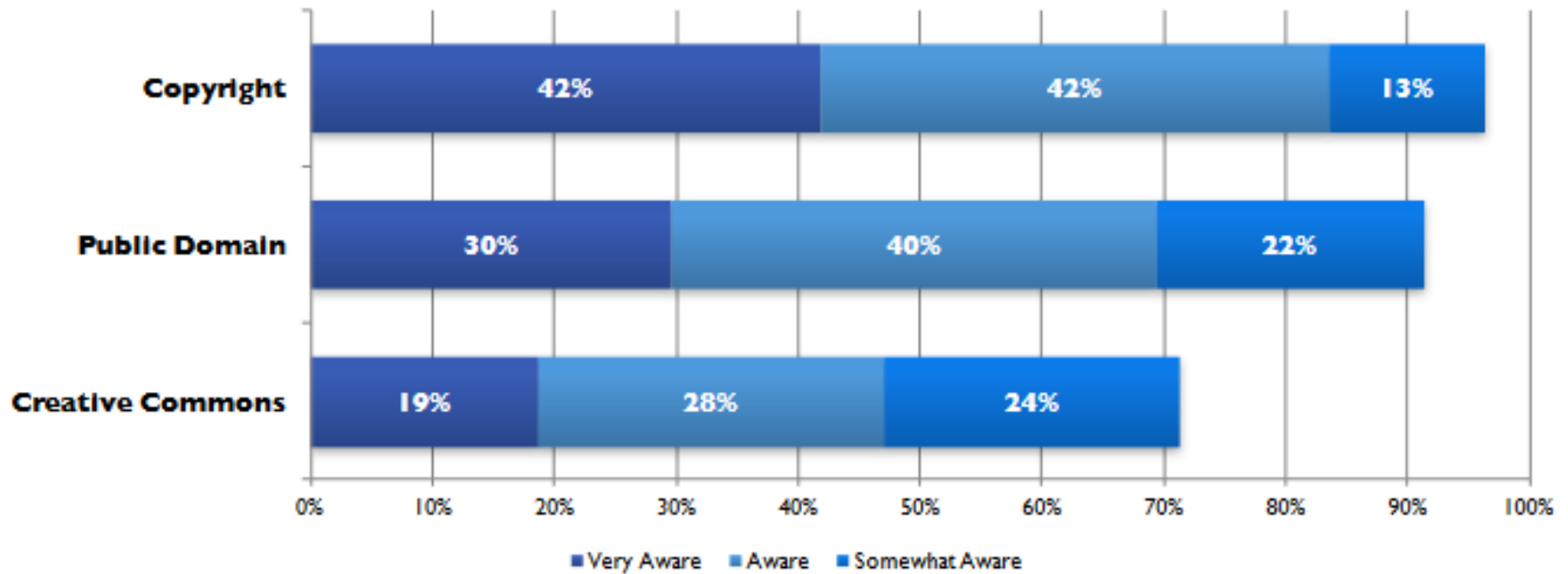
