## KITTIWAKE DANCE THEATRE

Kittiwake Dance Theatre is Newfoundland's only non-profit dance theatre. In our short history, we have built a repertoire of over thirty works, incorporating a variety of style and subjects from the dramatic, to the traditional and contemporary. A number of our works reflect our Province's rich history and cultural heritage, blending the talents of locally and nationally acclaimed choreographers, musicians, artists and technicians. Our aim is twofold:

\*To offer aspiring young artists a chance to remain in Newfoundland while pursuing a professional career;

\*To offer the community workshops and performances which reflect the width and breadth of the world of dance.

Kittiwake dancers have auditioned for and been accepted into programs such as the Royal Winnipeg Ballet's professional program, Quinte Dance, Interlochen Centre for the Arts, the National Ballet School, the Toronto Dance Theatre Program and the National Academy of Arts in the United States.
