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## **BS 504 Introduction to Biblical Studies: Old Testament**

#### Description

BS 504 introduces the student to OT study, stressing contemporary approaches to the historical and cultural setting and literary characteristics of the OT. Attention is given to the significance of the study of the OT for ministerial vocations represented in the Master of Arts programs, other than those specializing in Bible or Theology. The OT emerges from a cultural setting that is *different from those of contemporary culture*. Therefore, to study the OT is to learn to *receive* God's word cross-culturally, which is prepares us to *testify* to the message of God's word cross-culturally. Responsible and holistic interpretation involves moving creatively between the text's and cultural framework and our own.

#### Goals

- 1. Understand the theological story line in the Old Testament, and the theological connection between the OT and the NT.
- 2. Understand the major issues in OT interpretation and the basic historical–cultural background of the OT, and use this knowledge in the interpretation of the OT.
- 3. Begin integrating competent and responsible study of the Bible, particularly the OT, into your vocation.

### Procedures

- 1. Reading of extensive portions of the OT (and supplementary materials) and discussion of key passages in their historical, cultural, and literary contexts (10%).
- 2. Writing a commonplace book from your Bible reading (30%).
- 3. Writing two research papers, one on an OT–wide topic, the other on the interpretation of an OT book (30%).
