Introduction

The Shelhamer Family Papers include personal materials that relate to the Shelhamer family members as evangelists, authors, songwriters, musicians, teachers and church leaders. The Shelhamer family members include E. E. Shelhamer and wife, Julia Arnold Shelhamer, and their family, including the following:

- Jennie Arnold Jolley (sister to Julia)
- E. O. Jolley (husband of Jennie)
- Helen Arnold (sister of Julia)

- Minnie B. Shelhamer (evangelist and first wife of E. E., who died in 1902 after ten years of marriage)

The Special Collections Department of the B.L. Fisher Library received the Shelhamer Family Papers from Esther Shelhamer James, 18 cubic feet of manuscript materials, in 2007.

Content

The Shelhamer Family Papers consist mainly of documents from 1888-2000, the bulk of which dates between the mid-1940's and the mid-1970's. The collection is composed of 18 cubic feet of materials which include biographical (1894-1984), correspondence (1902-2000), subject files (1930-1990), literary productions (1900-1988), financial records (1947-1982), scrapbooks, lists (1930-1994), printed material (1898-2000), photographs (1888-1979), and realia. Series are arranged in the aforementioned order. The largest sections are the correspondence and literary productions.

Processing of this collection occurred between 2008 and February, 2009. The finding aid was prepared in February, 2009. Both were compiled by Dave Grant, Gari-Anne Patzwald, and Grace Yoder.

Biographical Sketch

Elmer Ellsworth (E. E.) Shelhamer, son of Josiah and Susan Ashbaugh Shelhamer, was born December 16, 1869. He was converted at the age of 16 and felt called to preach. He attended Wheaton College for three years, and during this time he joined the Free Methodist Church. He was a pioneer evangelist with the Pentecost Bands, working mainly in Pennsylvania and Illinois. He was ordained both deacon and elder in the Pittsburgh Conference. In 1892, he married evangelist Minnie Baldwin with whom he worked for ten years planting Free Methodism in Georgia, until Minnie died. In 1903 he married Julia Arnold (born September 21, 1879) who then bore four children.¹

E. E. and Julia Shelhamer continued to labor in the South, raising up the Georgia-Florida Conference which was organized in 1913. E. E. Shelhamer was its first district elder. E. E. and Julia wrote and published over fifty books, booklets and tracts. E. E. also wrote articles for thirty religious periodicals, and he was the editor of *The Repairer*, a holiness periodical. The Repairer was also a publisher that printed many of the books and tracts.²

E. E. Shelhamer was a world missionary, preaching in Australia, Africa, South America, Europe and Asia during the last 37 years of his life. His ministry was especially for the encouragement and spiritual deepening of the missionaries and native workers. E. E. and Julia Shelhamer's lives were characterized by strict economy in order that he might help holiness schools, worthy students, widows, orphans, superannuates, and home and foreign missions. They had an interest in lifestyle issues such as modesty in dress and sexual morality. They began a revival campaign in Joplin, Missouri, where E. E. passed away on January 21, 1947.³

Julia Shelhamer was an evangelist from age 13 on. She became a certified evangelist in the Free Methodist Church in 1898 and was ordained a deacon in 1939. Just after E. E. Shelhamer's death, at the age of 67, Julia served black children through a camp and she, along with her sister Helen Arnold, opened a mission in the slums of Washington D.C., ministering mainly to children. She raised money to educate children, and she also had a telephone ministry where people could call anonymously seeking spiritual help. Julia Shelhamer remained active proclaiming the Gospel until her last days. She died June 2, 1981, in Nicholasville, Kentucky, at the age of 101.⁴

Julia A. Shelhamer's father, I. R. B. Arnold and her mother was Adelia Nichols Arnold. The Arnolds "traveled the Green and Cumberland Rivers in chapel boats witnessing and holding revival meetings."⁵ I. R. B. Arnold was also an inventor of portable calcium light outfits for stereopticon and animated motion picture machines. Julia's sisters, Mary A. Beeson and Helen Arnold were also evangelists. Julia's sister and brother-in-law, E. O. and Jennie Jolley, were also evangelists and wrote many tracts as well.

Evangeline Shelhamer Surbrook, E. E. and Julia's oldest daughter, was born November 5, 1904. She received an A.B. degree from Kingswood Holiness College and there met her husband, W. L. Surbrook, president of the college. They were married August 29, 1928. Evangeline was an evangelistic speaker and musician until her unexpected death at age 25, on or about March 3, 1930.

Everett Shelhamer (sometimes advertised as "E. E. Shelhamer, Jr.") was the second child of E. E. and Julia. He was an evangelist and songwriter. The Shelhamer's third child, a daughter named Juliette, died in infancy. Their fourth child was Esther, born July 27, 1917, in Los Angeles, California. She graduated from high school from God's Bible School in 1933 and then attended two years of college there. She served as a Free Methodist medical missionary in Burundi, Africa, in 1937-1939. She was called an "honorary missionary" because she was too young to be a "regular" missionary. At the age of 24, Esther married Gilbert James (born November 5, 1915), a student at God's Bible School.

Gilbert and Esther James were prepared to go to Africa as missionaries for the General Missions Board of the Free Methodist Church, but World War II prevented overseas travel. Instead, they went to Shreveport, Louisiana to serve at Shreveport Free Methodist Church where they joined ranks with a Negro church. In Shreveport, Gilbert and Esther pioneered the effort to start a Bible school for black children. They served there from 1943 until 1945. Gilbert James then served as superintendent of the department of Negro Work and as superintendent of Interracial Evangelism for the free Methodist Church from 1946-1956. He served as pastor at Irving Park, Illinois from 1957-1959, and then attended school from 1960-1963. He then went to Asbury Theological Seminary as professor of Church in Society from 1965 until his untimely retirement in 1980 due to Alzheimer's disease. Gilbert

James was the founder of the Department of Interracial Ministries of the Free Methodist Church, developed Urban Ministries Program for Seminarians, and served as a short term missionary in India, Africa, and the Dominican Republic. He died January 21, 1982. Additional information about Gilbert James may be found in the collection "Papers of Gilbert James", ARC2006-001. After Gilbert's death, Esther remained an active part of Wilmore and Wilmore Free Methodist Church. Esther currently lives with her daughter, Ruth, in Arizona.

Series Description

Arranged alphabetically

Subseries: Diaries, Individuals within the Shelhamer family

Biographical information contains things such as birth certificates, obituaries, biographical/autobiographical information that is either typed or handwritten, professional information, memorial articles, and diaries.

Correspondence

158 folders (1902-2000)

Arranged chronologically

Correspondence consists largely of correspondence between family members, such as letters between Julia and Esther, between Esther and her children, and between Gilbert and Esther. There are also letters requesting publications, requesting funds for various ministries, letters between Julia and Gilbert regarding interracial ministries, and letters from various missionaries, especially in Burundi. Many of the letters are handwritten on various scraps of paper, on the backs of flyers or even on announcement cards.

Subject files

30 folders (1930-1990)

Arranged alphabetically by topic. Contains information on various ministries in which Shelhamer family members were involved.

Literary productions

129 folders (1900-1988)

Arranged alphabetically by subseries.

Subseries: Arnold, Helen; Beeson, Mary; James, David; James, Esther; James Gilbert; Jolley, E. O.; Music; The Repairer; Shelhamer, E. E.; Shelhamer, Evangeline; Shelhamer, Everett; Shelhamer, Julia; Shelhamer Memorial Mission News; and Shelhamer, Minnie.

Contains books, tracts, sermon texts and notes, music, poetry, art and other notes. Music is separated and arranged alphabetically by author. Folders from The Repairer, for which E. E. Shelhamer was editor, and containing many family member publications, contains *The Repairer* periodical as well as tracts published by The Repairer.

Financial records

7 folders (1947-1982)

Arranged alphabetically. Financial records are limited in scope. These records are personal logs kept by Mary Beeson, Julia Shelhamer and Esther James. There is a books of donations made to Mary Beeson. For Julia Shelhamer that are records of income from publications; income/expense reports, receipts and invoices, ledger, a limited number of cancelled checks. For Esther James there are records of money on Africa missionary work and Shreveport work as well as money received from Everett.

Scrapbooks

8 books.

Arranged alphabetically by person. There are scrapbooks belonging to Mary Beeson, Julia Shelhamer and possibly Helen Arnold. They contain clippings, revival meeting announcements, articles, tracts, poetry and music. Some of the scrapbooks appear to have been prepared to give to nursing homes or other similar places as a source of inspirational reading.

Lists

10 folders (1930-1994)

Arranged alphabetically. These are address books and address lists of Julia Shelhamer's. There is an extensive card file that Julia used to identify people and ways in which they supported her ministry.

Printed material

80 folders (1898-2000)

Arranged alphabetically by subseries.

Subseries: Advertisements; Bible: Book; Certificates: Flannelgraph Story; Hymnal; Invitation; Music; Periodicals; Programs; and Tracts. The tracts in this subseries are tracts that were collected or distributed by Shelhamer family members but not written by them.

Photographs

163 photographs (1888-1979)

Arranged alphabetically. Many of the photographs are from Africa. Many others are Shelhamer family members, especially E. E. and Julia. There are also some old photographs of the Arnold family, Camp Shelhamer, mission work in India, Shreveport and the Free Methodist Mission in Washington, D.C., among others.

Realia

This is a one cubic foot box containing printing plates of music and photographs, a painting on canvas, bookmarks and war ration stamps.

There are also two additional one cubic foot boxes at the end of the collection that contain oversized items and preservation originals that are referenced in the series listed above.
