
FROM THE ALUMNI PRESIDENT



his Winston K. Pendleton quote is so simple yet so true. Just think about it. It came to mind while I was analysing the results of this year's Annual Giving Fund. Imagine, even though the economic conditions in Newfoundland and Canada are desperate, 400 more alumni contributed this year than did the previous year! That's incredible, remarkable and, yes, very gratifying.

Why do alumni and friends contribute to Memorial University? I've asked donors, and the answers are varied. They range from a sense of loyalty to their alma mater, to a feeling of responsibility about helping the institution that provided them with the grounding for a successful career, to sheer pride in Memorial that has helped so many young people. There were, of course, many other answers and perhaps another time I will mention them, but for now I want to talk about the theme of the alumni of today helping the alumni of tomorrow. Contributions from alumni and friends have been growing in recent years and only now are beginning to have some effect on our rather sparse scholarship program. In the past five years alumni have donated \$1.9 million to this university, of which \$475,558 came in during the 1992-93 year. Last year, the Alumni Association asked alumni to contribute \$5 million to establish an entrance scholarship program and we hope this can be accomplished within the next four to five years.

I have observed the expressions on the faces of the young students who receive these scholarships. I have read the thank- you letters and have felt a great sense of pride and pleasure in being part of an organization that is spreading so much good will and financial help to our students, the alumni of tomorrow. You, too, must





The fishery: a crisis leading

By 1991, many fish stocks off Newfoundland had become so seriously depleted that on July 2, 1992, Ottawa declared a two-year northern cod moratorium until spring 1994 to allow stocks to rebuild. This has caused an estimated 20,000 fishery workers to lose their livelihood. The federal government subsequently announced a compensation package, the Northern Cod Adjustment and Recovery Program (NCARP), to provide payments ranging from \$225-\$406 per week, wherein those affected could take early retirement, or upgrade their knowledge of the industry, or train for occupations outside the industry. In addition, the program is designed to restructure the Newfoundland fishing industry in order to match harvesting and processing capacity to the natural limits of the resource. When the fishery reopens, it will operate with reduced quotas and fewer participants.

Memorial are involved in and concerned with the fishery. Seven of them discuss what can only be termed the mess the fishery, the mainstay of the

Newfoundland economy, is in.

On the scientific side is alumnus Larry Coady, B.Sc.'67, M.Sc.'73, director, Science Branch, Department of

Fisheries and Oceans, (DFO), St. John's. During his undergraduate years, he says, Dr. Fred Aldrich's friendship and enthusiasm led him to his career in marine biology. He talks about assessing the status of the fish stocks.

"The task is horrendously difficult and our estimates are subject to a high degree of uncertainty. Plus or minus 25 per cent is probably the best we can do. We've done a poor job of explaining that to industry and the fishermen, who regularly view scientific estimates as absolutely precise. The [Dr. Leslie] Harris panel made the point

(and we've made it as well) that the methodologies we use for our stock assessments are as good as any in the world but the data we use in those models are very poor. Our estimates of bycatch, discards and natural mortality, as examples, need to be improved."

He explains that scientists use two indices of abundance: research vessel surveys and catch effort information from industry offshore vessels. Each often told a different story. Larry admits, through the mid-1980s, they relied too heavily on the more optimistic industry reports, but by 1988, they had developed a statistical method for treating data more objectively and realized research vessel data were generally more accurate. Further, they had been using growth rates and recruitment levels (the number of 3-year-old cod entering the fishery, i.e, those old enough to catch) based on estimates from the '60s and '70s. Back then, recruitment levels were around 750 million fish a year; 1980s levels were about half that. Another factor was the growth rate of individual cod, which was slower in the '80s than in the '60s and '70s. These three factors together (slower growth, lower recruitment and improved methods) resulted in much lower estimates of northern cod biomass in the late '80s.

Larry refers to the Northern Cod Science Program, a \$35-million five-year program, implemented by Ottawa to respond to the Harris panel science recommendations. "The panel made it very clear our understanding of northern cod is meagre. We're now going into year four of the program and have expanded our understanding of northern cod ecosystem dynamics enormously."

In addition to the two original indices, scientists now have developed hydroacoustics techniques, they're working on an index of juvenile cod abundance before they recruit to the fishery, they're seeking inshore effort information and looking to incorporating

industry information and the experience of fishermen in more meaningful ways. "If we've got two indices telling us different things, we've got a problem, but if we have six indices with four telling us the same thing, we've got a lot more confidence in our advice." He is very cautious, noting there are 20 groundfish species within the 200-mile zone off our coast and, of the 17 he has information on, 11 are at or near record low levels. The present groundfish resource crisis goes well beyond northern cod and includes major flatfish resources on the Grand Banks, which have been subjected to foreign fishing pressure on the "nose" and "tail" of the Bank.

As for the future, available information hasn't yet been fully analysed, but DFO's February 1993 hydroacoustic survey shows fewer fish than the February 1992 survey. "The situation of the northern cod stock is extremely worrisome. We're dealing with an over- reliance on two year-classes, '86 and '87 (good recruitment years), which are bracketed by several poor year classes. We're working on having as much information as possible in the next year or two to advise on whether the fishery should re-open. Clearly, overfishing has been a major problem through the '80s. A wide range of other factors (environmental conditions, seals, multi-species interactions) also influence matters. The real difficulty is in weighing the significance of any one factor relative to another."

Among other fisheries matters, he is responsible for policy issues relating to the processing sector of the industry. Of some 250 registered processing facilities in the province 105 are groundfish plants with freezing capacity. "It's true, whether you measure capacity in the context of a four-month or a 12-month operating season," he says, "there is redundant capacity within the industry and there always has been." But this overcapacity has been exacerbated by the moratorium and the collapse of other groundfish stocks, both in terms of the number of plants that are closed and the utilization of those open. "We have problems of unprecedented proportions in the fishing industry," Les admits, "and there is overcapacity in the harvesting sector as well."

He recalls that in 1979 there were some 80 offshore trawlers in Newfoundland's fleet, but he doubts there will be more than 20 to 25 trawlers active this year. Trepassey, for example, had, until the fish plant

closed three years ago, some 800 to 1,000 jobs in the processing sector alone. "It's a classic example of what is happening in rural Newfoundland today. With the lack of fish, fishery employment declines as does any community's ability to survive. Unless we succeed in rebuilding those critical stocks, I'm afraid, not only in a community context but also in a provincial context, we face very difficult times."


But there are positive developments under way in the fishery, especially aquaculture. Les says Newfoundland has a natural environment for shellfish, especially mussels and scallops. "We're also seeing some successes, in the salmonids, for example, with the salmon growers in Bay d'Espoir." While he admits it's hard to ascribe aquaculture employment potential, he estimates 1,000 new jobs might materialize over a decade and he sees cod farming as another opportunity.

aquaculture and fisheries from Malaspina College in Nanaimo, B.C., and the development of a graduate diploma program in aquaculture at the Marine Institute. Given the crisis in the fishery, Boyd Smith's enthusiasm is yet another bright spot.

"While we're not encouraging large numbers of young people to work in the fishing industry, we firmly believe there are opportunities for people with higher levels of technical skills than the present work force has. We have in the industry large numbers of workers who historically have been employed in catching or processing fish, but many of them lack either the formal education or the technical skills necessary to work in the industry of today or the year 2000. Thus, continuing education of the present work force is our number- one challenge."

Taking considerable pride in the institute's ability to respond quickly to the industry's training needs, he describes how the institute has a partnership arrangement with the five community colleges and how it can mount courses on a demand basis whenever it's convenient for fishing industry workers. The NCARP compensation package has caused a surge in the number of established fishermen enroled in a whole variety of courses to enhance their knowledge of the fishery.

Boyd believes the secret to a viable fishery is not to rely solely on traditional groundfish species. "We have good news on some other species: crab and Gulf redfish stocks are in good shape, and sea urchin roe is in demand in Japan. We have to put management measures in place to ensure these don't become overfished." He, too, believes there is great potential in aquaculture, particularly for farming blue mussels and cod. He describes a new project involving both the institute and the cod farming operation of Sea Forest Plantation. "The efforts of that company in the 'ongrowing' of cod have produced fantastic fish of superior texture and taste, and this appears to be a real economic opportunity to add value to our traditional groundfish harvest."


Talking about the cod farming project is Charlie Power, BA(Ed.)'71, BA'73, former cabinet minister in the Peckford administration, president of Sea Forest Plantation, incorporated in

1985. "We buy small 16-to-20-inch cod in June and July, hold them for 100 days or so, and then market them in the fall when fresh cod isn't as plentiful. Our original plan was to have large corporate farms operating as a company with our own employees. Now we've changed the concept to a small, cottage industry type where small cod farms will supplement trap fishermen's income."

Sea Forest designed a \$4.5- million training package, funded by CEIC, wherein 400 fishermen in 100 trap crews at 20 sites in the cod moratorium area will be trained by Marine Institute instructors to farm cod. "We have permission to catch 1.5 million pounds of cod in June for training, but this year we will have to release these farmed cod. Normally, Sea Forest will enter into a contract with the fishermen to provide cages and market the cod in late fall." Charlie says it's important for fishermen to make as much from their fish as possible and that cod farming could supplement a trap crew's income by as much as \$20-30,000. Last year, for example, cod sold for 27 cents a pound in June but rose to 65-70 cents by October. "These small trap-crew farms will give fishermen a chance to find out from the growing side to the processing side to the marketing side, exactly where the profits are, and they will share in them."

Optimism is Charlie's password. "We are the only group that's trying to do something about the 'too few fish' side of the equation." Fish is doubled in size in 100 days and he predicts the industry could reach 15,000 tonnes (grown to 30,000 tonnes) or 66 million pounds. "I'm not naive enough to think this will happen right away but, in time, you're talking about a

\$100-million industry." He mentions spin-offs such as twine, nets, cages and transportation, and points out that cod farming takes the pressure off quotas. "You know," he adds, "if there's a silver lining to the cloud of the cod moratorium, it's cod farming."



Derek Barrett

A trap fisherman who might beneit from cod farming is alumnus Derek Barrett, BA(Ed.)'72. While in high school and university, he fished with his father and then had a 10-year career with DFO. In

1983, buoyed by DFO's optimistic quota estimates, projected to be some 480,000 tonnes in 1985 to 700,000 by 1987, he resigned his position as offshore inspection supervisor to start his own inshore operation in his home town of Old Perlican. "I had energy, I was 34 years old, and, I decided to go fishing." DFO even offered him a leave of absence but, "I felt, if I don't burn my bridges, I'll never make it." He worked hard the first few years for very little return. "It wasn't all that hot; the signs had already started. We had two relatively good years', '89 and '90. My vessel Tenacity grossed about \$175-180,000 in 1990 but in '91 we grossed just \$7,500."

The moratorium has greatly affected him since his mainstay has been cod caught in traps, although other income comes from flounder, capelin and crab. In 1992, however, with his traps out until the moratorium was declared, he managed to catch only four fish. "That's hard to believe when two years before we had caught something like 675,000 pounds."

Derek has decided not to take advantage of NCARP but to try to find other work. "When the fishing season was over, I always hustled up some work and that's what I'm doing now. I owe very little money and have some put aside, but when I go back fishing, I hope they [the regulators] don't make too many changes so that I won't have to gear up too much, because I could-

n't afford it." He says both the Harris and the Dunne report did a great job of identifying the problems and implementation, respectively, but he's disappointed by how slowly measures are being put in place.

"Unless there's something more positive than we know now, I can't see the fishery re-opening in the spring of '94. But Dr. Templeman [former fisheries scientist] used to say that cod is a very resilient species that bounces back more quickly than many other species, which gives me a bit of encouragement." When Derek does return to fishing, he will have to make his fish worth more, even though he's always sold good, fresh fish. He thinks cod farming has possibilities and suggests, instead of being frozen, more fish should be sold fresh to the customer. Is he sorry he decided to return to fishing?

"If I could turn back the clock to 1983, knowing what I know now, would I have done it? I don't think so. But in retrospect, did I enjoy it? Look, I've had a ball, a great time. Even though my family and I have had some rough moments, I'm at the point where I'm still a young man, and I've still got the world by the tail. I love fishing, if I was allowed to go fishing. I'm not looking to make fortunes of money because I say there's no economic justification for fishing. You either love it or have no alternative."



Ches Blackwood

On the processing side is Ches Blackwood, Dip.Sc.'48, B.Sc. (Dalhousie), Dip.Eng., (Dalhousie), B.Sc. (food technology, Dalhousie & Nova Scotia Tech), MA (Toronto), PhD

(Washington), who worked first with provincial fisheries and then 25 years with DFO in Halifax and Ottawa. "In 1978, I was appointed director of Atlantic fisheries and then I decided I'd like to take a crack at the private sector." By 1980, he had joined a brandnew company, Clarenville Ocean Products, a small, single- plant inshore

company. Within a couple of years he owned half interest as did ResourceCan, a company set up in Newfoundland to invest in resource industry opportunities.

The next 10 years saw the company become Conpak Seafoods, and expand to 14 plants. "We've made acquisitions strategically located around the island, which enables Conpak Seafoods to be in the somewhat unique position of being basically supplied from inshore fish by being a year- round operation. With plants and buying stations all around the province, if the fishery fails in one area, it will likely be good in another. We move fish around the island, depending on volume of fish."

Conpak processes all kinds of groundfish, including underutilized species, inshore fishermen catch. It also processes shrimp, lump roe, and buys lobster for outside marketing and, last year, was the largest east coast capelin processor. Buying fish from about 2,500 independent fishermen, the company employs close to 3,000 plant employees at peak times, selling 80 per cent to the U.S. with some sales to the rest of Canada and to Japan. "Markets are pretty good," he says and adds, "I think Conpak is a good model for Newfoundland fish plants with the focus on having a year-round operation and multi-species-type fish plants, not relying on a single species or source of supply."

Of course, the present crisis presents problems. "We're in a real struggle here in some respects, not only because of the northern cod but also because other stocks are significantly down. We share in that crisis, obviously. We do have surplus processing capacity, and we are downsizing and restructuring that capacity."

He says the future fishery will be one with fewer plants, fewer companies, but better financed, more technologically advanced companies. "The industry will employ fewer people but they will have more secure, better paying jobs, both in harvesting and processing. I'm optimistic as long as we can get rid of the perception that the fishery somehow has to employ all those people who can't otherwise find

jobs. We must let the industry seek its own proper level so it can be competitive on a world-wide basis. And I see no reason, if we have the fortitude to do this, why we can't have a successful fishery in the future."

But how will the crisis affect rural communities? Alumna Rosemary Ommer, MA (Glasgow), MA'74, PhD (McGill), is research director of Memorial's Institute of

Economic and Social Research (ISER). She's working on a research proposal to look at the social, biological and medical implications of the cod moratorium.

She believes we need to have a better way to manage our resources, both in terms of the fishing resource and in terms of creating other ways of sustaining ourselves. "My private view is that this situation is both a crisis and an opportunity," she says. "Up until now there's always been another way to sidle out, or hope this will pass, but now, with a crisis of such magnitude, it is essential to take a serious look at the total problem, and to look at diversification."

Well aware that economic diversification has been tried before when megaprojects tended to be favored, Rosemary prefers to look at smaller projects such as ecotourism or computer technology in rural communities to interface with larger urban centres. "Every problem has its solution tucked away in it somewhere. Because if the urban environment and the industrial environment are becoming dysfunctional, overpopulated, and the periph-

eral environments are suffering from underemployment, if you can transfer that activity into the peripheral areas, you'll relieve the burden on the urban environment. You're forced to do the research and development to take you into post-industrial technol-

ogy. You re-supply those peripheral communities on the strengths they have. All rural communities have strengths but they've never been recognized as such."

The main idea is to have a mix of things. "Look at the history of Newfoundland outports over 250 years. People survived using imaginative ways to put packages together: furring, trapping, woods' work, seal in the spring, fishing and some business on the side." She says the strategy of

combining different things to make a community viable has equal applicability today. "Alternatives are staring us in the face, but they're considered too small. Perhaps we need a PR agent to sell small as beautiful."

She's encouraged to find people from all walks of life seeing things the same way. "There is a complementarity of interest here where we could all help one another. This is where the university can play a crucial role." She echoes President May's statements at

to speak in several

bring people

should facilitate,
and we are well

trained to do that. This is a mega-crisis, and it is blatantly obvious the solution is going to have to be multiple and complex."

Dr. May succinctly summarized the present crisis when he said, "Economic diversification is crucially necessary to provide alternative opportunities, but it is apparent that a 'big fix' is not possible."






The Physical Education Graduates' Anniversary is scheduled for the May 27-29, 1994, weekend.


Memorial's president, Dr. Arthur May, hosted a reception preceding a luncheon where federal fisheries minister John Crosbie was guest speaker.


Barnes House reunion

Robert Roberts, B.Sc.'61, MD'65 (Dalhousie), professor of medicine and cell biology, is chief of cardiology and director of the Bugher Foundation Center for Molecular Cardiology at Baylor College of Medicine at Houston, Texas. 



IN MEMORIAM

Dr. John Bartlett Angel, the recipient



of an honorary doctor on engineering degree from Memorial in 1974, died in St. John's on January 10 at the age of 79. Dr. Angel was educated at Methodist College, Memorial University College and McGill

University (B.Eng.'35). During his student years, he sailed with his famous relative, Captain Bob Bartlett, on several expeditions to Greenland and the Arctic. He joined his father's company, United Nail and Foundry in 1935, becoming president in 1948. He and his family established the F.W. Angel Lecture series at Memorial in memory of his father.

Dr. Bruce Fraser, a member of the



Faculty of Medicine from 1979- 91, died in England on October 6, 1992.
Born in Hamilton, Ontario, in 1946, he obtained a PhD in anatomy at Queen's University in 1977 and completed post-doctoral studies in

anatomy at the University of Cambridge, England. He then worked as a lecturer in anatomy at Charing Cross Hospital, University of London until coming to Memorial first as an assistant professor of anatomy in 1979 and then as an associate professor in 1990. In failing health because of multiple sclerosis, he relinquished his duties in 1991.

Dr. Agnes O'Dea, the recipient of an

He received his R.T. certification in 1960 and his general A.R.T. in 1962. In 1969, he went to the College of Trades and Technology (now the Cabot Institute), where he was an instructor in clinical chemistry until he retired in 1989. In 1987, the Canadian Society of Laboratory Technologists honored him for his "tireless efforts in furthering the professionalism of Newfoundland's medical technologists." In 1990, he received the first Award of Merit of the Society's Newfoundland branch for dedication and service and promotion of the medical laboratory technology profession. Mr. Sidel played an important role in the training of many technologists who work in the province today. He earned the esteem of his colleagues and the affection of his students for whom he always found time for personal encouragement, and will be missed by all who knew him. A bursary in his name has been established at the Cabot Institute to assist a student in the laboratory technology program.


