## 1993-94 MEN'S BASKETBALL PREVIEW

There's an atmosphere of excitement on campus. This can be attributed to a revamped athletic department, an enthusiastic freshman class, a good recruiting year, and a group of veterans clamoring for success in the athletic arena.

No one has been dying to be heard as much as men's basketball Coach Ed Reilly. The 1993 campaign was a frustrating one. Bryant lost its last four games by less than seven points, three in overtime. Coach Reilly hopes an influx of young talent will be the right prescription to put Bryant on the right road.
"We look to capitalize on the healthy mix of an experienced upperclass and a talented, hungry group of newcomers," says Coach Reilly.

Four starters return from last year's club that finished 7-18 overall, 4-14 in the NE-10. What the record doesn't indicate is that Bryant was in many games until the final buzzer. Overtime games were the norm as seven contests went into the extra session, including a remarkable 5 out of the last 6 games in league play. Bryant's inability to clinch the close ones was a drawback that effectively kept the team out of postseason play, something that has to change.
"Specifically, we need to shoot the basketball better, handle end-of-game situations more adroitly, team rebound to offset our lack of size, and quickly learn how to win," says Reilly.

How quickly depends on Bryant's ability to handle some tough teams early and to bring together a mix of young talent.

The schedule shapes up as one of the more challenging in recent history, highlighted by a six day-two game trip to Florida during the winter break. Bryant will face six opponents who participated in last year's NCAA Division II tournament, including NE-10 regular season champion Bentley and tournament champion St. Anselm.

A closer look:

## FRONTCOURT

One of the keys to this year's success will be developing consistent play from the frontcourt, particularly in rebounding and defense.

Cocaptain David Burrows, ( $6.5, \mathrm{SR}, \mathrm{F}$ ) will look to improve on his $18 \mathrm{ppg} / 8 \mathrm{rpg}$ posted a year ago, both team highs. An honorable mention All Conference selection in '93, Burrows is considered to be one of the top players in the NE-10 and will be relied on heavily throughout the season.

Chris Berntsen, ( $6.5, \mathrm{JR}, \mathrm{F}$ ) who started 24 games last year and was the second leading rebounder, will be called upon to increase his offensive production and be a stabilizing force inside.

Another letterman, Omar Shareef ( $6-5,50, F)$ will also build on his first year numbers. Omar brings tremendous energy and athleticism to the
frontcourt and should develop into an explosive player on both ends of the floor.

## BACKCOURT

Colin Lawson, (5-9, SR, G) will provide direction from the backcourt and build on his late season play of last year when he developed into one of the league's top point men. A fine competitor and excellent 3 point shooter, Lawson should enjoy his finest season to date.

Joining him in the backcourt is Jerome Grier,( $6 \cdot 2, \mathrm{SO}, \mathrm{G}$ ) who contributed 15 ppg and led the team in 3 point accuracy. A strong rebounder at the guard spot, Grier will be called upon to step up his point production and continue to develop defensively.

Perhaps the team's finest outside shooter, Scott Collins,(6-2, SO, G) will provide depth and scoring punch from the perimeter. Collins needs to develop his consistency and floor game to spark Bryant off the bench and challenge for playing time at the 2 position.

## NEWCOMERS

Last year's recruiting effort focused on improving depth, size, and shooting. It appears that all concerns have been addressed with the signing of five players. Heading that list will be 6'4" swingman Kevin 0'Brien ( $\mathrm{JR}, \mathrm{F} / \mathrm{G}$ ), a junior college transfer. One of the premiere 3-point shooters in Florida JUCO, Kevin's perimeter skills and experience will be felt immediately. His versatility and maturity enable him
to make contributions from either the backcourt or small forward spot.

Joining the mix at small forward will be Marc Mulherin, ( $6-5, \mathrm{FR}, \mathrm{F}$ ) a gifted athlete and talented baseline player. Extremely competitive and seasoned, Marc will make his presence felt as he challenges for a starting position.

The tallest recruit in Smithfield is $6^{\prime} 10^{\prime \prime}$ Steve Wiacek. The Rhode Island native will provide valuable minutes at the center spot and will utilize his skills in the high post.

The backcourt fortunes were enhanced with the addition of two recruits. Point guard Herman Thomas (5-9, FR, G), brings exceptional speed, quickness and playmaking ability. He should provide immediate help at the point. Scoring guard Noel Watson (6$3, \mathrm{FR}, \mathrm{G})$ is perhaps the most versatile player added to the mix. An extremely talented athlete, he is capable of playing at any of four positions. Good size and tremendous instincts should enable Watson to become a top-notch defender, which will help immediately.

Coach Reilly says, "We feel the urgency to take this program to the next level. Our focus and energies will solely be directed towards that end."

It looks like an exciting season for players and fans alike.

## THE COACHING STAFF



ED REILLY Head Coach

Coach Reilly is beginning his fifth season at Bryant. In the summer of 1989 he took on the assignment of rebuilding the Bryant basketball tradition. It hasn't been easy, but Reilly is determined to turn the program around. "I want to make the Bryant basketball program as well respected as Bryant's academic reputation," says Reilly.

Prior to becoming the first full time basketball coach in the history of Bryant's Division II program, he spent a decade with some of the best basketball minds in the country - Joe Mullaney, Pete Carril and George Blaney.

After two years as a high school coach at Kingswood Prep in Connecticut, he became Mullaney's assistant at Brown University in 1978. In 1980 he went to Princeton to work for Carril, one of the nation's college coaching deans, before returning to his alma mater at Holy Cross in 1982 as Blaney's top asssistant, a position he held for seven years before taking over the Bryant program.


ED GAGNON
Assistant Coach
This is Ed's fifth year as an assistant to head coach Reilly. Ed came to Bryant four years ago after an outstanding high school coaching career at Bishop Feehan High in Attleboro, MA.

During his 16-year tenure there, Ed was one of the most successful coaches in Southeastern Massachusetts. His record was an impressive $220-160$ while directing the Shamrocks to eight Southeastern Mass. Conference divisional championships.

At Bryant he assists coach Reilly with the daily practice sessions in addition to scouting and recruiting duties throughout the northeast.


GLENN SENECAL Assistant Coach

This is Glenn's second season as an assistant to Coach Reilly. Glenn came to Bryant from Holy Cross where he served as an assistant coach to George Blaney for three years.

At Bryant he assists Coach Reilly with daily practice sessions, scouting and recruiting, as well as monitoring the academic progress of the team.

During the summer, Glenn helps Coach Reilly coordinate the Bryant Boy's basketball camp. His responsibilities range from coaching the JV team, formulating the film exchange, assisting on court during practice, and bench coaching at games.

DR. LINDA C. HACKEIT Athletic Director

Dr. Linda C. Hackett took over the reigns as Bryant's new Athletic Director in the spring of 1993. Prior to that she had been the Director of Athletics at Smith College since 1988.

A graduate of Indiana University, she received her MA, MBA, and PhD from the University of lowa. Hackett was associate director of athletics for nine years at lowa where she served on numerous Big Ten Conference committees and supervised conference and national championships in basketball, field hockey, track and field, tennis, gymnastics, and cross country.

She also chaired the Women's Athletic Administrators' Committee of the Big Ten in 1986 and 1987. Currently active in the ECAC and National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators (NACWAA), Hackett also served as president of the New England Women's 8 Conference from 1989-91 and chair of the Seven Sisters Athletic Directors in 1990-91.

She is only the third full-time Athletic Director in the history of Bryant College.


CONI FICHERA Assistant Director of Athletics

Coni became Assistant Director at Bryant in the fall of 1993. A 1992 graduate of Plymouth State College, where she earned a BS in Physical Education with a minor in Business Administration, she was awarded the Asa S. Bushnell internship at the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) and worked a year in championships administration, legislative services, and the football, hockey, basketball, and baseball service bureaus.

At Plymouth State she was the first recipient of the Panther Award, given for outstanding athletic achievement. A four year participant of the varsity field hockey program, she was chosen captain her senior year. She also played two years of varsity lacrosse.

A native of Derry, New Hampshire, she was recently inducted into her high school Hall of Fame at Pinkerton Academy (Derry, NH) for outstanding contribution to the Academy and Society.

Her duties at Bryant are primarily in the areas of compliance and eligibilty, as well as assisting Dr. Hackett in administration. In addition, she is also the advisor for the Bryant Women's Field Hockey club.


## BOB REALL Intramural Director

Bob has been a member of the Bryant Athletics staff since 1976, when he became the head hockey and baseball coach and gym manager for Bryant. He became the full-time Intramural Director in 1979. Since that time Intramurals at Bryant have fluorished under his direction. Over 90 percent of Bryant students participate in intramurals. Five new activities were added to the program and Bob now oversees seven women's and seven men's sports as well as four coed activities. He instituted the first Intra-state Flag Football Tournament in 1984.

In addition to his duties as Intramural Director, Bob is also the Women's Softball Coach and the PA Announcer for the men's and women's basketball games.


CHARLIE MANDEVILLE Head Trainer

Charlie joined the Bryant staff in 1979 as Cross Country coach and athletic trainer.

After graduating from Rhode Island College in 1980, Charlie was the trainer for four years with two minor league hockey clubs, the New England Whalers and the Chicago Cougars.

In the off season he has worked with the New England Patriots, the US Olympic camp at Lake Placid, NY, the Oceaneers Professional Soccer team, and most recently the Boston Red Sox.

In addition to his duties as head athletic trainer, Charlie also coaches women's cross country and track at Bryant, and was influential in the ground-breaking of Bryant's new 8-lane 400 meter outdoor track and its cross country course, considered one of the best in the country.


> JON SJOGREN '88 Facilities Manager

Jon Sjogren ' 88 became athletic facilities manager this fall in addition to his duties as the Bryant baseball coach.

He is responsible for the day-today staffing and operation of Bryant's Jarvis Fitness Center, the Multipurpose Activities Center (MAC) and Bryant gymnasium, as well as coordinating the athletic equipment for all 14 Bryant teams.

Jon joined the Bryant staff in 1991 as head baseball coach and began rebuilding the Bryant baseball tradition. During Jon's three-year playing career Bryant enjoyed their best years in the history of the program.

In 1986, Sjogren, a shortstop, played a key role in the drive to the Northeast-10 conference championship and a berth in the national NCAA Division II tournament. It is the only time a Bryant baseball team has qualified for the national tournament.


MARGARET FLEISCHAUER Sport Information Assistant

This is Margaret's first year at Bryant, in charge of publicity and promotion of Bryant's 14 Intercollegiate sports. A western Pennsylvania native, Margaret earned her Bachelor's degree from nearby West Virginia University, where she also played basketball before a severe knee injury ended her athletic career.

Margaret went on to earn a master's from the University of Pittsburgh and spent five years as a Program Director for YMCAs in Florida and Woonsocket, RI. She began a career in Sports Information in the fall of 1989, serving three years as an assistant to the SID at the Community College of Rhode Island.

Margaret has also been the head volleyball coach at Mt. St. Charles Academy in Woonsocket for the past four years.

## Study Many Fields

Business studies form the core of the Bryant curriculum, complemented by the liberal arts. Students can pursue a bachelor of science in business administration degree in accounting, applied actuarial mathematics, computer information systems, finance, management, or marketing. A bachelor of arts in liberal studies degree can be earned with a concentration in communications, economics, English, history, and international studies. Students also have the opportunity to double-concentrate in two business or two liberal studies areas.

Both business and liberal arts students can take advantage of the College's accelerated MBA program. Through this program, students can earn an MBA with just one additional year of full-time study, provided they meet the graduate program's admission standards.

## Get a Head Start on their Careers

Bryant graduates are ready to begin successful careers. Beginning in the freshman year, the Career Services Offices helps students consider the possibilities available to them. Career interest surveys help students define their direction; seminars on career paths, resume writing, and interviewing prepare them for the job search. Extensive on- and off-campus recruiting makes that search easier, in the last four years, an average of 208 companies recruited on campus.

Most Bryant students have real-world experience before they graduate, giving them an advantage over the competition. Students in nearly every academic concentration get experience

in their field through on- or off-campus internships. More than 300 students did internships last year.

## Enjoy The Athletics Facilities

Some of the finest athletics facilities in the northeast are right here in Smithfield. Our athletes enjoy 35 acres of playing fields for intercollegiate, club, and intramural competition. Bryant's 375-acre campus includes extensive, challenging, and yet relaxing cross country trails. The latest facility developments include six new outdoor tennis courts and an 8 lane, 400 -meter outdoor track that the competition is already calling one of the best in New England. The Multipurpose Activity Center (MAC) includes three multipurpose courts, five racquetball courts, and the Jarvis Fitness Center and its extensive Nautilus and free weight equipment. Next door, the gymnasium holds a threecourt, 2,700 seat arena.

## Have Time For Activities

Students plan most of the College's social activities through the Student Programming Board. This group sponsors Winter Weekend, Spring Weekend, dances, rock performances, pub

nights, trips, and lectures. Cultural activities are also brought to campus through The Performing Arts Series.

There is a student organization at Bryant for just about every interest. Clubs include the Adventure Club, Bryant Players theater group, Cultural Exchange Organization, PreLaw Society, and Professional Women's Association. Some groups are community oriented, such as Big Sisters of Bryant, Bryant Environmental Action Club, Bryant Hunger Coalition, and Students for Social Awareness. The College's fraternities and sororities are among the groups known for their fund-raising activities that benefit the homeless, ill, or disadvantaged.

More than 90 percent of Bryant students participate in intercollegiate, intramural, or club sports. On the intercollegiate level, teams compete in the Northeast-10 Conference of the NCAA Division II. Women's sports are basketball, crosscountry, tennis, track, softball, soccer, and volleyball. Men compete in baseball, basketball, crosscountry, golf, tennis, track, and soccer.

## On an Incredible Campus

Bryant offers a spectacular, modern 375-acre campus in a comfortable, suburban setting. Yet Bryant is only 15 minutes from the city of Providence with its restaurants and social activities, less than an hour from Boston, and three hours from New York. Students benefit from city life, but are largely protected from its problems. The Bryant Office of Public Safety provides 24 hour security and access to campus is limited to one main entrance.

The campus was designed to foster relationships among all members of the College community. The Unistructure is home to all classes and most faculty offices. The Bryant Center, the hub of student activities, contains many eating places, meeting places, and shops. The Koffler Technology Center features 200 terminals, microcomputers, and workstations.

Over 80 percent of Bryant students live on campus, and the College's attractive housing options are an important reason why. The Freshman Complex offers family-like support and traditional double rooms. Older students can choose among single rooms, double rooms, or suites. Many seniors prefer the independence of living in the apartments of the Townhouse Village. More than 75 percent of students stay on campus each weekend and for a variety of social events.

They may be the youngest team Bryant has ever had but they also may be the most tatented. The women's basketball roster contains five sophomores, four freshmen and two upperclassmen, and if they mature by season's end, they could surprise a few teams in the conference.

Last season Bryant surprised a few people when they posted a $12-15$ mark and qualified for the conference playoffs. Third year coach Mary Burke (23-
32) hopes to work some magic again this year.
"Considering our youth, I'm pleased with the direction the program has taken so far."

With only two returning starters, Burke will try a number of lineups before narrowing down her first five. She sees the team's continuing maturity as key to their success. "Our hard work in the preseason will hopefully pay dividends later."

Beth Connealy and Liz Davies, the two returning starters, are a good nucleus to build on and the other three sophomores Katie Haik, Heather Lopes, and Becky Hall have matured and improved with a year of play. Leadership and scoring punch will be provided by senior captain Jen Cloos and Burke hopes to get a good season from junior Kris Berg, although recent knee surgery lists her as questionable.

The other question marks lie in four new recruits. Burke feels she has some talent to build a good team and hopes to qualify for the playoffs again this year. Among conference opponents, Burke lists Bentley as the powerhouse other teams hope to emulate, cites AIC as possessing great athletic ability, and says Saint Anselm is a quality team.

## FRONTCOURT

The inside game is a strength this season with the return of Liz Davies. Davies ( $6-0, \mathrm{So}, \mathrm{C}$ ) posted some impressive numbers last year ( $16.8 \mathrm{ppg}, 10.1$ rpg ) and will be relied on heavily to contribute forty solid minutes. Davies led the team in scoring and rebounding and was voted the conference freshman of the year.

Kris Berg (5-10, Jr, F), plagued by injuries the past two seasons, is nursing a sore knee and is questionable at strong forward. Becky Hall (5-9, So, F) has improved and will contribute valuable minutes at both guard and forward slots.

Katie Haik ( $5-8, \mathrm{So}, \mathrm{F}$ ) gained confidence and experience at the four position last year and will look to improve on her freshman numbers.

## BACKCOURT

Burke has five players to work with in determining the starting guards.

Beth Connealy (5-7, So, G) will likely start at the two position. Connealy has a clean bill of health after arthroscopic knee surgery. A phenomenal athlete and tremendous leaper, she was Bryant's third leading rebounder ( 6.5 rpg ) and will provide help on the boards.

Heather Lopes (5-7, So, G) will see playing time at both the point and off guard positions. Another fine athlete with great speed and quickness, she will be key in Bryant's defensive game.

Senior captain Jen Cloos ( $54, \mathrm{Sr}, \mathrm{G}$ ) will provide leadership. One of the teams' finest shooters, Jen will enhance Bryant's scoring opportunities from the perimeter.

## NEWCOMERS

The graduation of starters Kim Ross, Bridgett Casey, and Kelly Jacob resulted in some very big holes at key positions. Coach Burke's recruiting efforts were geared toward acquiring a true point guard and shoring up the power forward spot. Two freshmen who will contribute immediately are Mary Beth Feeney (5-7, Fr, G) and Kristin Regan ( $5-10, \mathrm{Fr}, \mathrm{F}$ ). Feeney is an All State selection out of New York. A great ball-handler who sees the floor extremely well, her quick adjustment to college ball is essential for Bryant to overcome the loss of point guard Kim Ross.

Regan is described by Burke as an impact player. Aggressive and extremely tough on the boards, she will fit nicely into Bryant's physical defensive game.

Providing help in the low post and a rest for Davies is freshman center Tara Foley ( 60 , Fr , C). Foley will have some of her toughest battles in practice against Davies, which will help her mature and develop her inside game.

Guard Stephanie Meyer (5-8, $\mathrm{Fr}, \mathrm{G}$ ) will provide intensity off the bench while she learns the new system.

Overall, Burke is encouraged by her young charges.
"We need to not be intimidated so easily and that comes with experience.

Our conference (NE-10) is one of the strongest in Division II and I think if the younger players can adjust quickly we will do well."

Now in its 13th year, the Northeast-10 conference has established itself as one of the premier Division II conferences in the country.

The conference is comprised of ten private New England colleges, six from Massachusetts, one each from Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Hampshire and Vermont. Founded in 1980 as the Northeast-7, the charter members were Bryant, AIC, Assumption, Bentley, Hartford, Springfield, and Stonehill.

St. Anselm was admitted to the conference in 1981, Merrimack followed suit in 1984, replacing Hartford, now a Division I institution. Quinnipiac and St. Michael's are the conference's newest members, joining in 1987 to form the Northeast 10 .

All NE-10 teams play each other twice during the regular season, once at home and once away. The 1994 season will be capped off by the Northeast-10 tournament, with the top eight women's teams advancing, while the men hold an open tournament, with all ten schools participating.

The winner of the conference tournament receives an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II Regionals.
