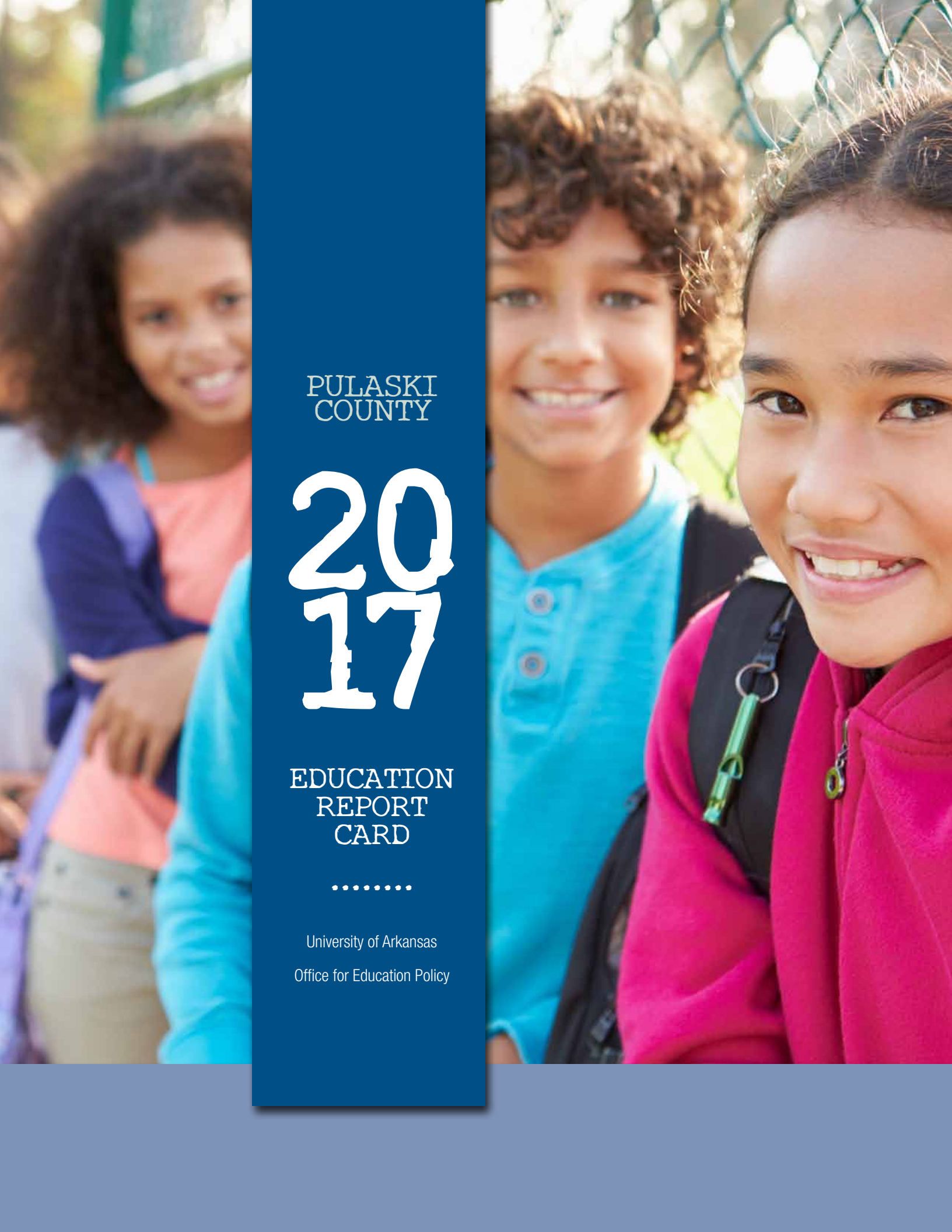

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

There are exciting changes

in how the performance of Arkansas schools is being measured, and the Pulaski County Report Card highlights how students in area schools are performing.

Pulaski County students are demonstrating greater growth in achievement at the Elementary and High School levels than are the students in the state overall, and academic growth for students in Middle level schools is similar to the state average. This is particularly noteworthy since schools in Pulaski County serve students who are more likely to be at risk for not achieving in school than students in the state overall. Pulaski County schools have lower academic achievement, School Quality and Student Success scores, and graduation rates than students in the state overall. Due to lower scores in these areas, Pulaski County schools are less likely to receive an “A” or “B” rating than are other schools across the state.

Schools are assigned **A-F letter grades** to help parents and the public better understand how well a school is performing. This grade is based on an Overall index that is a combination of a Growth score, an Achievement score, and School Quality/ Student Success Indicators.

We think the **Growth Score** is the most important measure of school quality. Growth measures how much individual students at the school increase their scores from year to year, and the Growth Score reflects how well schools are increasing students’ learning over time. Using growth as a measure of school success levels the playing field because all students are evaluated by the extent to which they grow from their own starting point; thus, students facing socioeconomic barriers to achievement have the same opportunity for growth as do their peers from advantaged backgrounds. All students can grow their understanding, and we should expect all schools to foster student growth, regardless of family income, first language, or learning needs.

The **Achievement Score** is a familiar measure of student performance that reflects how well students score on the state’s annual exams. Schools serving more advantaged students typically receive “good” scores because a high percentage of their students passed, while schools serving a larger percentage of students who lived in poverty, participated in special education, or were learning English often receive lower scores because a higher percentage of their students were unable to pass the test. The clear connection between Achievement Scores and student demographics suggests that point-in-time test scores are not a good measure of how well a school is educating students, but rather a reflection of the wealth of the community being served by the school.

The **School Quality/ Student Success Indicator Score** is a new indicator for schools that includes several measures like student attendance, reading at grade level, science achievement, and science growth. High school scores also reflect student enrollment in advanced courses, computer science courses, and community service learning. ACT performance and GPA are also considered. This indicator comprises a relatively small portion of the overall school index, and includes many measures not previously reported, which may mean that differences between district scores may reflect differences between how the data are collected and reported.

This report card presents information about these key performance indicators for the districts in Pulaski County. The Growth, Achievement, School Quality, and Overall scores of each traditional school district are compared to the average scores of the districts in Pulaski County. The scores of the public charter schools are compared to the average scores of all schools in Pulaski County.

Highlights of the Pulaski County Report Card:

We believe that the growth scores are the best indicator that districts are doing what's really important: helping all students learn. An average district, where students are growing academically just as predicted, will have a growth score of 80. In some districts, however, students are demonstrating greater increases in their academic performance from one year to the next than we would have predicted. To have a 'good' growth score, to be in the top 25% of schools in the state, Elementary schools need a growth score of 83 or higher, Middle level schools need a growth score of 82 or higher, and High Schools need a growth score of 81 or higher.

eStem students demonstrated the greatest academic growth overall, with students at the Elementary, Middle, and High School levels receiving high growth scores. **North Little Rock School District** had the highest overall growth score among the traditional districts, reflecting high growth at the High School level. **Little Rock School District** had the highest growth at the Middle level and **PCSSD** had the highest growth at the Elementary level.

eStem also had the highest point-in-time achievement of the **Pulaski County** area schools, followed closely by **Academics Plus**. **Pulaski County Special School District** had the highest achievement score among the traditional districts, overall and across all school levels. Since point-in-time achievement is highly correlated with student demographics, we want to point out that among districts where more than half of the students are eligible for the free/reduced lunch program, **LISA Academy and Jacksonville Lighthouse** reported the highest achievement.

eStem had the highest School Quality/ Student Success Indicator Score at the Elementary level, **Exalt Academy** had the highest score at the Middle level, and **Quest Academy** was the highest scoring in School Quality at the High School level. Among the traditional public schools, **Jacksonville** had the highest School Quality/ Student Success Indicator Score at the Elementary level, **Little Rock School District and Pulaski County Special School District** tied at the Middle level, and **North Little Rock** was the highest scoring in School Quality at the High School level. **Premier High** has the lowest student to teacher ratio, with one teacher for every five students. Graduation rates were highest at **Academics Plus** where 100% of the class of 2017 graduated on time.

There are many things that contribute to a 'good' school, but we believe student academic growth is perhaps the most meaningful measure of school performance or school effectiveness. Many **Pulaski County** schools had high growth at one or two school levels, and there is evidence of variation in growth rates between schools within the same districts. We recommend district and school leaders examine where their students are not demonstrating high growth, examine high growth schools to see what those schools are doing differently, and consider how they can further support learning for their students.

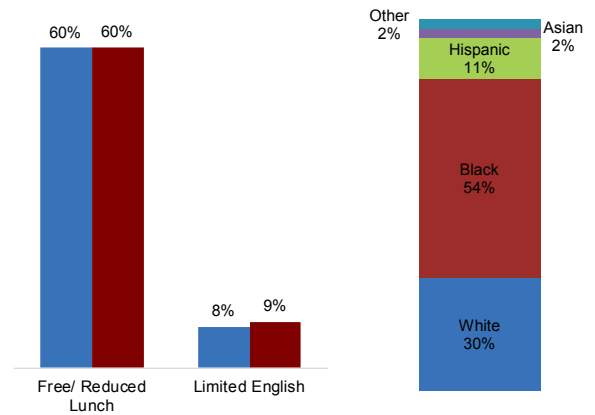

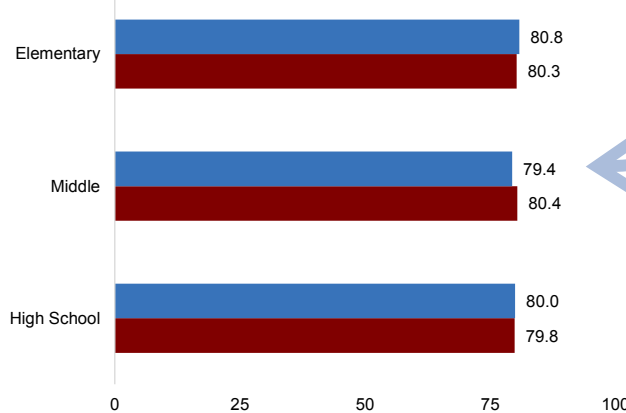

The **annual per-pupil expenditure, ACT Composite score,** and percentage of **students who graduated** 4 years after entering high school are additional indicators of school performance.

Growth Score



Growth Score:

This indicates how much the district's students in grades 3-10 improved over time on state assessments in English language arts and mathematics. This score also includes how well non-native speakers are progressing toward English language proficiency.

Districts serving fewer At Risk students don't always have higher growth scores. Growth scores are less related to student characteristics than achievement scores.

Growth scores range from 70.2 to 89.7.

The Achievement Score indicates how well the district's students in grades 3-10 performed on state assessments in English language arts and mathematics. This achievement score is weighted so schools earn more points for students in higher achievement levels.

Districts serving fewer At Risk students typically have higher achievement scores. Achievement scores are more related to student characteristics than growth scores.

Achievement scores range from 1.9 to 117.6.

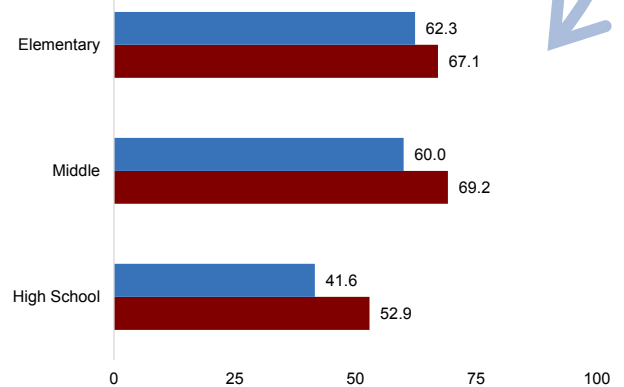
The School Quality and Student Success score

combines several measures of student engagement, readiness, completion, and success.

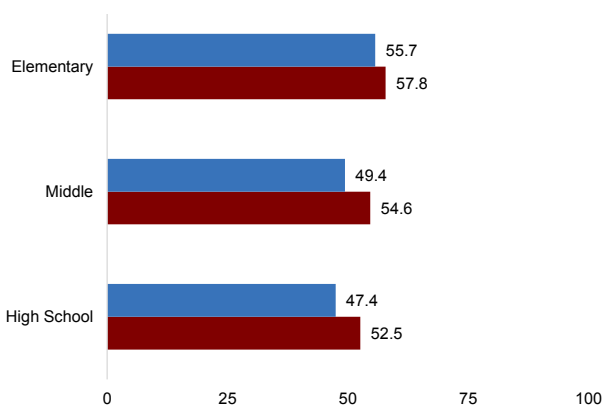

School Quality scores range from 3.6 to 98.5.

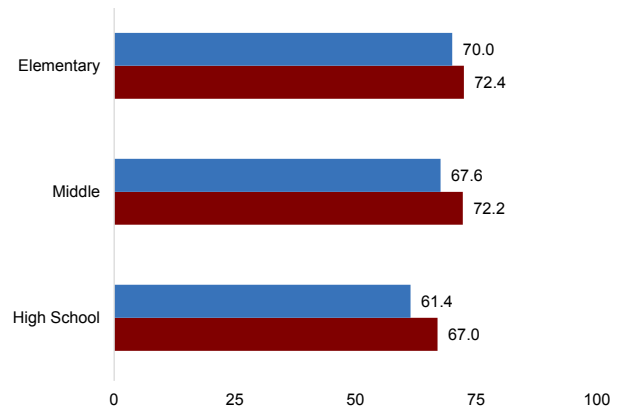
Achievement Score

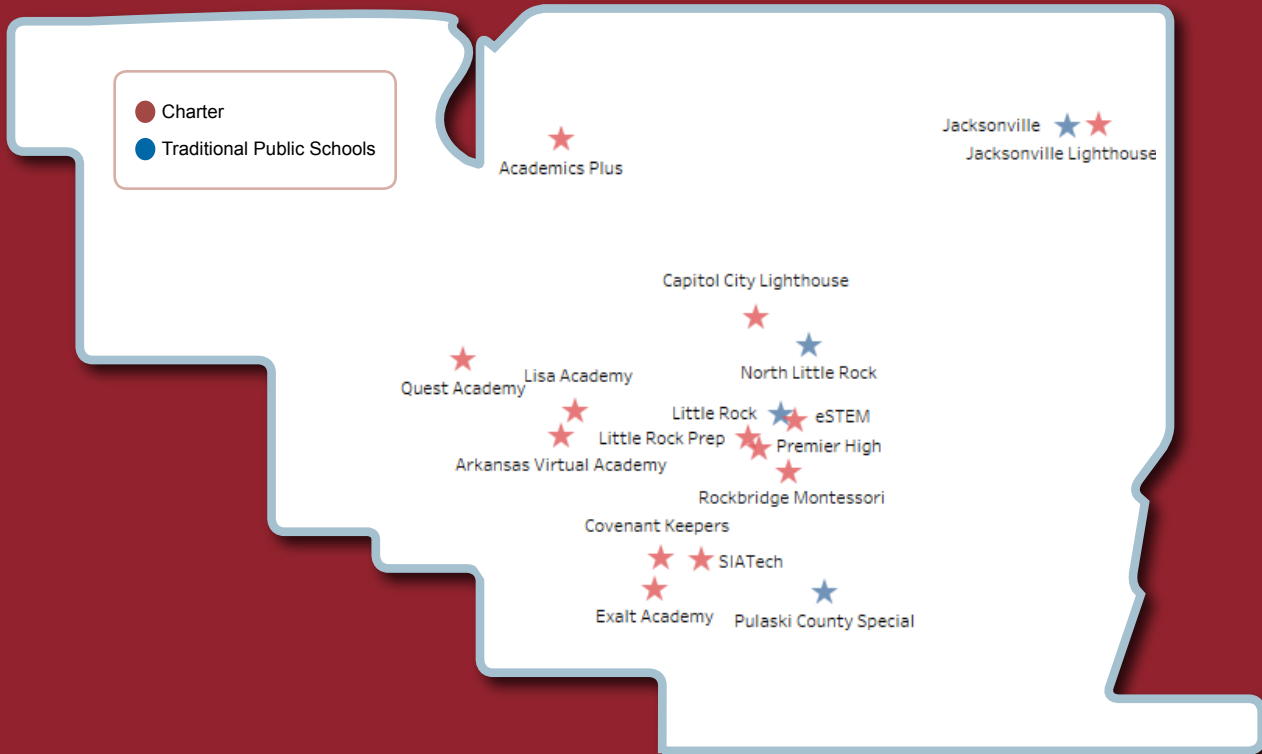

OPEN-ENROLLMENT PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS

Open-Enrollment Public Charter Schools are free public schools that can draw students from across district boundaries.

Students who want to attend an open-enrollment charter school complete an application. Charter schools are prohibited from selecting students based on academic performance, student demographic characteristics, family income, or any other type of information.

If more students apply to attend the charter school than there are seats available, the school must hold a public, random lottery to select students.
