

CASH RECEIPTS FROM FARMING IN OHIO, 1983

Ohio cash receipts from farm marketings of crops, livestock and livestock products were \$3,673,664,000 in 1983, up less than 1 percent from the previous year. At \$2,135,849,000, the 1983 sale of crops increased 2 percent from 1982 and accounted for 58.1 percent of the total cash receipts from farm marketings compared with 57.2 percent a year earlier. Cash receipts from livestock and livestock products, at \$1,537,815,000, were down 2 percent from the previous year and accounted for 41.9 percent of the total compared to 42.8 percent in 1982. Government payments amounted to an additional \$170,749,000, up over 400 percent from 1982. This increase in payments was due to the PIK Program.

Total 1983 realized gross farm income in Ohio was \$4,365,000,000, of which \$691,300,000 was from services other than farm marketings. About 85 percent of the total gross farm income was needed for production expenses, leaving a figure of \$657,300,000 as realized net income compared to \$401,300,000 in 1982. The percent of income going for expenses compares with 91 percent a year earlier. Farm production expenses in 1983 showed a 4 percent decrease.

Soybean cash receipts, at \$776,789,000 for 1983, placed number one and accounted for 21.1 percent of the total cash receipts from the farm marketings in Ohio. Soybeans ranked first in 1974 and annually each year since 1977. The all-time high for any commodity was \$1,116,156,000 for soybeans in 1980, more than 48 percent above the 1983 total. Corn, with 1983 cash receipts of \$680,442,000 remained in second position and increased only 1 percent from 1982. Wheat maintained the sixth position ranking with cash receipts of \$210,435,000, a 15 percent increase from a year earlier. Greenhouse and nursery crops totaled \$168,000,000 for the seventh position in total receipts.

In the major livestock groups, cash receipts from dairy products of \$642,492,000 increased 4 percent from 1982 and retained third position. Fewer marketings and a decrease in prices caused hog cash receipts to decline 16 percent from 1982 and drop to fifth position. Cattle and calves, with sales of \$359,385,000, increased 3 percent above 1982 to gain fourth position. Poultry and eggs held eighth position with cash receipts of \$162,646,000, a 4 percent increase over 1982.

Mercer County with cash receipts of \$129,503,000, retained first place ranking over second ranked Darke County with cash receipts of \$128,040,000. Mercer County has held first place ranking since 1978. The next three highest counties were Wayne (\$118,885,000), Putnam (\$85,665,000), and Fulton (\$83,136,000). Leading counties by commodities were: soybeans, Hancock; corn and hogs, Darke; cattle and calves and dairy products, Wayne; wheat, Wood; other crops, Lake; other livestock, Mercer.

PERCENT OF TOTAL



PROCEDURE

Ohio estimates of cash receipts from farm marketings were published initially in 1927 and annually since 1929. These county estimates of cash receipts are published by the Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology of the Ohio State University and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in cooperation with the Statistical Reporting Service of the United States Department of Agriculture. This bulletin contains 1983 Ohio county cash receipts estimates and revised 1981-82 State estimates. County production estimates of various commodities are published annually in the <u>Ohio Agricultural</u> Statistics bulletin.


Current cash receipts estimates for Ohio and other States appear in the USDA's <u>ECONOMIC</u> <u>INDICATORS</u> OF THE FARM SECTOR: <u>State Income and Balance Sheet</u> <u>Statistics</u>, <u>1983</u>. These estimates are prepared by the Economic Research Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, from basic data provided by the Statistical Reporting Service, the Census of Agriculture, and other sources. Estimates presented in this publication may differ from previously published data due to revisions in marketings, inshipments, inventory numbers, and other data, as more complete information becomes available. Cash receipts for some commodities were combined to avoid disclosure.

Cash receipts from farm marketings of farm products represent calendar year gross receipts from commercial market sales as well as loans (net of redemptions) made or guaranteed by CCC and purchases under price support programs. The value of home consumption and production expenses is excluded. County estimates of cash receipts from marketings are derived by allocating State estimates to counties on the basis of crop reporting and Census marketings by crop reporting districts. Check data such as county dairy production from the milk market administrators are also used.

The definition of a farm includes places which had annual sales of agricultural products of \$1,000 or more. This definition has been used since the 1974 Census of Agriculture. The average cash receipts per farm will aid in the comparison of counties with similar farm practices better than a comparison of total cash receipts.

This bulletin has been prepared through the efforts of many people. Included are personnel of agricultural agencies throughout Ohio. The greatest recognition is due the large number of Ohio farmers and agri-businessmen for their interest and help in providing the basic data used in compiling this information.


FIGURE II CASH RECEIPTS FROM FARM MARKETINGS OHIO, 1983




